But as a citizen, I depend on my elected representatives not to be so bribed by campaign contributions and swayed by continual communications with the developers that they give in to their wishes.

I agree that as RVA gets more urban and vertical we're using more public transit and bicycles. Still most people require one car per person. Living in the Fan district I know what that does to parking. Until there is real evidence - not just paid developer speculation - that less parking is needed, we should keep the parking minimums. As the regulators in my field say, "sorry about the regulations but there's only so much (physics) space; we made these rules for equitable sharing."
