# About the CCC

---

- Originally created on January 11, 1993
- Revised on April 27, 2015, and again on February 12, 2024
- Composed of 17 volunteer members
  - City Council appoints 15
    - One that lives or works in each Council District
    - Five at large that do not need to live or work in the city
  - Mayor appoints 2
  - Director of the Department of Public Works or designee
- Meets on fourth Wednesday monthly either in person and virtually

# CCC Duties

---

- Provide advice and recommendations to the City Council and the CAO, concerning programs and policies:
  - To reduce litter,
  - Encourage proper disposal and recycling, and
  - Improve the local environment
- Provide advice and recommendations to the Department of Public Works concerning any funding appropriated to or administered by the Department of Public Works related to the duties and functions of the Commission
- Serve as a local affiliate of Keep Virginia Beautiful





# Priorities for 2026

---

- Reduce illegal dumping
- Expand recycling to Richmond Public Schools
- Solution for disposal of brush and yard waste
- Expand waste reduction programs to decrease landfill waste
  - Composting
  - Small business recycling
  - Multi-family residential recycling

# Community Clean-ups

---

- Support community clean-up events
  - Provide pickers, vests, gloves, bags, etc.
  - Advertise the event on CF Engage, Meetup and all CCC social media accounts
  - Coordinate bulk pickup of trash collected or illegal dumping sites
- Coordinate one time clean-up events
  - Specific day events (MLK Day of Service, Earth Day)
  - Group events (corporate event, college event)
  - Focused events (problem areas around city)



# Public Awareness

- Table at fairs, festivals and farmer's markets throughout Richmond
- How to organize a community clean-up
- Education on proper recycling and disposal of household hazardous waste
- Give Aways
  - Reuseable grocery bags
  - Reuseable water bottles
  - Pencils made from recycled material
  - Refrigerator magnets with recycling information



# Recycling Events

---

- Held three times a year (January, May, September)
- Parker Field Annex, 1710 Robin Hood Road (Corner of Robin Hood Road and Arthur Ashe Blvd)
- Collections:
  - Electronics (fees may apply for some items)
  - paper shredding (up to five boxes or bags)
  - household hazardous waste items (oil-based paints, pesticides, gasoline, etc.)
  - Christmas trees in January only





# Adopt a Spot

---

- The program is open to individuals, organizations, or businesses to "adopt" a street, intersection, lot, park, gateway - almost anywhere
- Your Responsibility:
  - Select an area you or your organization is interested in cleaning and fill out the agreement form and send it to us
  - Commitment: Agree to keep the selected area cleared of litter for at least two years
  - Each time you maintain your adopted area, fill out the Adopt-A-Street activity form and send it back to us.
- We provide materials to help with the cleanups:
  - Grabbers
  - Gloves
  - Bags
  - DPW staff will collect the bags of litter
