Richmond Public Safety Emergency 9-1-1 Telecommunicators Week

Whereas, The Honorable Levar M. Stoney, Mayor of Richmond, and The Honorable Members of Richmond City Council, the governing body of Richmond, Virginia in the United States of America, do hereby unite in solidarity and common purpose to declare public safety emergency 9-1-1 telecommunications to be vital to the life, health, and safety of all Richmond residents and those visiting our beautiful and historic city; and

Whereas, Public Safety Telecommunicators provide a critical human lifeline to residents, visitors, and officers in the field 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and serve as crucial members of first response teams helping to save lives and protect property and the environment in response to crime, medical emergency, and/or natural and man-made emergency, disaster, or incident; and

Whereas, In delivery of their duty, Richmond Telecommunicators manage telephone and other electronic public requests for emergency assistance from law enforcement, fire, medical, or other emergency services and dispatch appropriate public safety units accordingly; and

Whereas, Public Safety Telecommunicators operate specialized comprehensive emergency response systems, alerting systems, Text Telephone (TTY), and Telecommunications Devices for the Deaf (TDD) systems for people with auditory challenges; and

Whereas, Occurring each year on the second full week of April, National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week traces its celebration of telecommunications professionals to a California locality in 1981 and was designated as such by the United States of America Congress in 1991; and

Whereas, On behalf of its Telecommunicators, in 2016 Richmond proclaimed and established the second full week of April each year as Richmond Public Safety Emergency 9-1-1 Telecommunicators Week;




