Call to Order

Council President Michael Jones called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m. and presided.

Invocation was offered by Pastor Jason Nicholas of The Chapel, 1808 Mactavish Avenue, Richmond, Virginia.

Members of Council and the audience recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chamber Emergency Evacuation Plan Announcement and Citizen Speaker Guidelines

Upon the President's request, Deputy City Clerk RJ Warren provided information on the appropriate manner in which the Council Chamber is to be evacuated in the event of an emergency along with citizen speaker guidelines.

Councilor Ellen Robertson, on behalf of City Council, honored and recognized the importance of women in the Richmond community and noted that City Council proclaimed March 8, 2023 to be Richmond Women's Day.

Councilor Stephanie Lynch, on behalf of City Council, noted the negative impacts of invasive species. Councilor Lynch stated that to further awareness and action, City Council proclaimed the month of March to be Richmond Invasive Species Awareness and Action Month.

Citizen Comment

CD.2023.065 February 27, 2023 Citizen Comment Period Speakers List

David Kohler, Newtowne Home Owners Association Vice President, Chamberlayne Industrial Corridor President, Richmond Property Owners Association Vice President, addressed Council and stated his opposition to the establishment of rental inspection districts referenced in RES. 2023-R006, adopted February 13, 2023. Mr. Kohler also stated that previously established government programs and regulations should be used to address rental inspections rather than establishing new law. Mr. Kohler further stated that the proposed regulations would require landlords to raise rents and add to the affordable housing shortage in the city.

Sylvester Artis addressed Council and informed members of his negative encounter with a Council employee. Mr. Artis stated that no member of the public should be subjected to the verbal abuse that he experienced.

Nancy Kunkel, Richmonders Involved to Strengthen our Communities (RISC) member, addressed Council and stated that the city was experiencing a severe affordable housing crisis. Ms. Kunkel informed members of the difficulty city residents experience obtaining affordable housing. Ms. Kunkel also stated that the city should dedicated \$10,000,000 in funding for the Affordable Housing Trust Fund (AHTF).

Martin Wegbreit, RISC member, addressed Council and referenced city legislation related to funding the AHTF. Mr. Wegbreit stated that the city needed to established \$10,000,000 in dedicated funding for the AHTF to adequately address the housing crisis in the city.

Angelino Montealegre, RISC member, with Spanish to English translation assistance provided by Roberto Garcia, addressed Council and informed members of the living conditions within mobile homes in the city. Mr. Montealegre requested the release of \$300,000 in city funding to repair and replace mobile homes in the city.

Reverend Derek Starr Redwine, RISC member, First Presbyterian Church Covenant Pastor for Discipleship, addressed Council and stated that he believed the city had broken its promises to provide dedicated funding for the Affordable Housing Trust Fund and to provide \$300,000 for the repair and replacement of mobile homes in the city. Reverend Redwine requested that Council make things right by providing funds to the AHTF and for mobile home repair and replacement.

Pastor Ralph Hodge, RISC member, addressed Council and stated that RISC was present to inform Council of its concern for affordable and safe housing in the city. Pastor Hodge also stated that RISC would continue to voice its concerns until the city provides funding to address affordable housing and mobile home repair and replacement in the city.
