Ms. Moore Clarke explained the plan was a policy outlining the development of equitable multimodal transportation to meet the needs of residents in the city.

Kelli Rowan, Department of Public Works Office of Equitable Transit and Mobility Transit, Planning and Mobility Program Management Consultant, reported that the adoption of the plan was the first step in modernizing the city's strategic multimodal transportation plan. Ms. Rowan invited Council to join the Richmond Connects Advisory Committee for a public meeting at Main Street Station on June 6, 2022, at 10:00 a.m.

Steve Taylor, Council Policy Analyst, advised the committee of past challenges in filling positions on certain boards and commissions with defined membership criteria.

Member Michael Jones moved to forward the following board appointment applications to Council with the recommendation to approve, and to continue consideration of one of two vacancies on the Central Virginia Waste Management Authority, and the two remaining vacancies of the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority.
