# Office of Community Wealth Building (OCWB) 2021 Mid-year Performance Report

Caprichia Moses Spellman, OCWB interim director, provided the 2021 mid-year performance report for the Office of Community Wealth Building, which included an executive summary, a departmental overview, highlights and updates of 2021 programs and services, narratives of success stories, OCWB partnerships, grant performance outcomes to date and future initiatives. A copy of the report provided has been filed.

Members of Council thanked Ms. Moses Spellman, OCWB staff and ambassadors for their hard work especially while navigating the COVID-19 pandemic.

Reginald Gordon, deputy chief administrative officer – Human Services, was available to answer questions regarding the continued progression of the ambassador program.

Councilor Katherine Jordan inquired regarding an expansion of the Mayor's Youth Academy as a deterrence to gun violence.

# Federal Infrastructure Bill Update

Ron Jordan, council lobbyist, Advantus Strategies, introduced the city's federal lobbying team, Joseph Eannello and Brad Mollet, Capital Counsel, LLC, who provided Council with an update regarding congressional appropriations and Richmond specific congressionally directed spending, an overview of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) and a preview of the proposed Build Back Better Act funding for consideration. A copy of the presentation provided has been filed.

Mr. Jordan along with Christopher Frelke, Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities director, were available to answer questions regarding the proposed congressionally directed appropriation for Southside parks.

Chief Administrative Officer Lincoln Saunders addressed Council regarding the city's grant application process and the intent to increase the city's staffing capacity in an effort to take full advantage of IIJA funding opportunities, which are awarded through a competitive process.

Mr. Eannello reminded Council that the Build Back Better Act is still pending as he fielded a question pertaining to housing funding.

Councilor Andreas Addison mentioned consideration of a proposed amendment to the city's legislative proposals addressed in Res. 2021-R083, which would request the allowance for Council representation on the Virginia Housing's board, later that evening at the Formal Session of Council.
