TO AMEND THE FY 2022 ADOPTED CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BUDGET AND TO AUTHORIZE THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER TO ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE \$67,166.39 FROM GRTC FOR THE RICHMOND SIGNAL SYSTEM (RSS)

PHASE III PROJECT

PURPOSE: To amend Ord. No. 2021-042 adopted May 24, 2021, which adopted the Capital Improvement Plan for fiscal year 2022 and to authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to accept funds in the total amount of \$67,166.39 from GRTC and to appropriate the revenues by amending the FY2022-2026 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget by \$67,166.39 for the purpose of funding the connection of seven BRT Bus Stations into the traffic signal communication network as part of the RSS Phase III.

REASON: To accept and appropriate \$67,166.39 from GRTC for the network communication connection of seven BRT Bus Station.

RECOMMENDATION: The Department of Public Works recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND: The Department of Public Work has started the construction of the RSS Phase III, which is funded through coordination the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and the Richmond Regional Transportation Planning organization (RRTPO). This project will expand the traffic signal communication network to the eastern, northern and western areas of the City.

As part of the project, seven BRT Stations (Staples Mills East, Staples Mills West, Shockoe Bottom East, Shockoe Bottom West, East Riverfront East, East Riverfront West, and Rocketts Landing) will be tied to the traffic signal communication network via fiber optic. This will provide reliability to the BRT communication system, and significantly reduce monthly operation cost.

Connecting the mentioned BRT Bus Stations to our traffic signal fiber optic network, the City will have the option to monitor CCTV's cameras in these stations, while improving the efficiency of the communication, established few years ago as part of the Pulse Project, between the traffic signal system and GRTC servers.

FISCAL IMPACT / COST: None. GRTC will reimburse the City in the amount of \$67,166.39 for this work.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: The addition of these funds will allow the Department of Public Works to fund this BRT Stations into the fiber optic network.

BUDGET AMENDMENT NECESSARY: Yes. This request amends the Adopted FY2022-26 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) and appropriates \$67,166.39 to the "RSS Phase III Project.
