### **Call to Order**

Chair Michael Jones called the meeting to order at 1:01 p.m., and presided.

### **Electronic Meeting Announcement**

Deputy City Clerk RJ Warren, pursuant to the current ongoing declaration of a local emergency concerning the COVID-19 pandemic confirmed by Res. No. 2020-R025, adopted March 16, 2020, and as permitted by section 2.2-3708.2(A)(3) of the Virginia Freedom of Information Act, announced the meeting would be held through electronic communication means. Deputy City Clerk Warren stated notice of the meeting was provided to the public on February 11, 2022 and through Legistar on the city website in accordance with usual practice. He also stated members of the public were encouraged to provide comments in writing prior to the meeting and all comments received prior to 10:00 a.m., on Thursday, February 17, 2022, were provided to committee members. 6. ORD. 2022-032 To amend City Code §§ 26-871, concerning the establishment of annual license taxes, and 26-873, concerning exemptions to license taxes, to increase the threshold for business, professional and occupational license taxes from \$100,000.00 to \$250,000.00.

Shelia White, Finance Director, provided an introduction and additional background information regarding the proposed ordinance.

Vice Chair Kristen Nye inquired how information regarding the increase of the threshold for professional and occupational license taxes would be communicated to the public.

Ms. White stated that the Office of Public Information and Engagement would take necessary action to communicate the information to the public and local businesses. Ms. White informed the committee that city administration fully supported the action referenced in ORD. 2022-032, and that the Department of Economic Development would also assist with informing the local business community.

Member Ellen Robertson requested to be added as a co-patron of ORD. 2022-032.

There were no further comments or discussions and Member Ellen Robertson moved to forward ORD. 2022-032 to Council with the recommendation to approve, which was seconded and unanimously approved.

The following resolution was considered:

8. <u>RES.</u> 2022-R007 To express the Council's support, should the citizens of Richmond approve a second referendum for the development and operation of a resort casino, for using the revenues received as a result of the development and operation of such resort casino to provide a two-penny reduction in the City's real estate tax rate and funding for public schools and community infrastructure.

Member Ellen Robertson provided an introduction and additional background information regarding the proposed resolution. Member Robertson stated that she believed the establishment of a resort casino was a great opportunity for the city to remain competitive. Member Robertson also stated that potential revenue received from a resort casino could help the city fund the needs of residents.

Vice Chair Kristen Nye stated that she supported RES. 2022-R007 and the proposed real estate tax reduction.

There were no further comments or discussions and Vice Chair Kristen Nye moved to forward RES. 2022-R007 to Council with the recommendation to approve, which was seconded and unanimously approved.
