§ 1. That section 9-58 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2020) be and is hereby

amended and reordained as follows:



ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

Amend City Code §9-58 which assigns polling places in the city for the purpose of adding polling locations within the second Council District, third Council District, sixth Council district and seventh Council Districts. A total of four new polling locations will need to be added (Precinct 216; 311; 611 and 709).

BACKGROUND

This O&R is requesting that City Code §9-58 be amended to add new polling locations for voting. A total of four new polling locations will need to be added (Precincts 216; 311; 611 and 709). Two precincts were created in order to heal a split precinct that was created from the new maps that were drawn at the Redistricting process at the state level.

The two new polling locations for these new precincts are: Precinct 216 – Maggie Walker Governor School at 1000 North Lombardy Street Precinct 311 – Maggie Walker Governor School at 1000 North Lombardy Street Two new precincts were created by splitting two current precincts in half. These two precincts that were split in half, Precinct 609 and Precinct 708, because both were near the 5,000 registered voter benchmark.

According to state law, no precinct can have more than 5,000 registered voters. Therefore these two precincts were split in half, and new precincts were created in order to be in compliance with state law.

The two new polling locations for these new precincts are: Precinct 611 – United Nations Church at 214 Cowardin Avenue Precinct 709 - Main Street Station at 1500 East Main Street

The proposed new polling places are accessible for persons with disabilities and lie within precinct boundaries which is, although outside of the precinct's boundaries, it lies well within one mile of the precinct boundaries as required by the Code of Virginia. Upon adoption of this ordinance, all registered voters affected by this change would be notified at least fifteen days before the election on November 8, 2022, pursuant to the requirements of §24.2-306 of the Code of Virginia,

The Office of the General Registrar anticipates that the costs of the mailing is anticipated as \$15,000, which is the total payment for the Redistricting mailer which will be mailed to all Richmond voters. It is anticipated that this notice will be mailed at the end of August.

Section 24.2-206 of the Code of Virginia prohibits changes to polling places within 60 days of a general election. As such, this ordinance must be adopted by September 6, 2022. Notice of this proposed change must be published prior to enactment once a week for two successive weeks before adoption.

The requested introduction date is May 9, 2022.
