RICHMOND CITY COUNCIL COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD

By virtue of the authority vested in the United States of America, Commonwealth of Virginia, Virginia Code of Laws, and the Richmond City Charter, Richmond City Council, the governing legislative institution of Richmond, Virginia, in the United States of America, does hereby and officially exalt:

Facts and Faith Fridays

Whereas, Richmond City Council, the governing legislative institution of Richmond, Virginia, in the United States of America, does hereby declare the health and wellness of Richmond residents and visitors as vital to the ongoing happiness and success of our thriving community; and

Whereas, Critical to the wellbeing of Richmond residents and visitors is the prevention of and protection from life-threatening injury, illness, and disease, which directly impact our individual and collective health, safety, livelihood, and prosperity; and

Whereas, Beginning in early 2020, Richmond became confronted with the enveloping shadow of a new threat to the health of its residents in the form of an unfamiliar, highly infectious, and often deadly viral disease, Covid-19; and

Whereas, During the onset of this rapidly spreading disease, many people worked diligently on the front lines and behind the scenes, putting their health and that of their families in harms way in responding to the crisis as thousands were becoming infected and many lives were being lost; and

Whereas, As we navigated these uncertain times together in Richmond and across the nation, a valid, reasonable, and persisting sense of fear, distress, grief, loss, and anxiety permeated our consciousness and constrained our lives; and

Whereas, With these outlooks at hand came fundamental questions and concerns regarding how to properly protect ourselves, our families, and those we care about against the disease; and

Whereas, During that time a growing alarm also began to sound regarding racial and ethnic disparities in Covid-19 outcomes, particularly of people of African American, Latino, Alaska Native, Pacific Islander, and Native American descent, which were experiencing much higher rates of Covid-19 infection, hospitalization, and death, as percentages of Americans; and

Whereas, In direct response to such disparities, questions, and concerns, in March 2020 the Virginia Commonwealth University - Massey Cancer Center established a collaborative program with African American Clergy in Richmond and across Virginia, entitled *Facts and Faith Fridays*, to help convey and exchange Covid-19 information between medical personnel and ministers on behalf of their congregations; and

Whereas, Established the same month the World Health Organization declared Covid-19 a pandemic, Facts and Faith Fridays, which began as a weekly call and evolved into virtual meetings, has been a tremendously successful forum for sharing important healthcare information, dispelling falsehoods, and strengthening the resolve and outcomes of people of African American descent, as it has reached many thousands of people;

Now, Therefore, Richmond City Council does hereby recognize, honor, celebrate, and bestow the Richmond City Council Community Service Award upon the Facts and Faith Fridays program and thanks its organizers, participants, and supporters for their leadership roles in helping make Richmond and Virginia an even better and healthier place to live, love, work, learn, play, visit, and enjoy family.
