PURPOSE: To amend Ord. No. 2022-055 adopted May 9, 2022, which adopted the Capital Improvement Plan for FY 2023 and to authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to accept funds in the total amount of \$1,765,000 from the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and appropriate the revenues by amending the FY2023-2027 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget by appropriating \$\$1,765,000 for the purpose of funding the CMAQ Project.



DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

REASON: To accept and appropriate \$1,765,000 within the Transportation Category of the Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Years 2023 – 2027. These funds CMAQ funds were awarded\allocated by VDOT after the FY23 CIP Budget was proposed.

RECOMMENDATION: The Department of Public Works recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND: As part of the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) Program under the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act, the City applied for a grant to retiming the traffic signal within the City's boundary. The Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization (RRTPO) has recommended the State to fund this project through the CMAQ Funds which has been included in the Six-Year Improvement Program (SYIP) 2023-2028.

Signal retiming is oriented toward optimizing a controller unit's response to the demands of roadway users, including all types of motor vehicles, bicycles and pedestrians. Signal timing strategies include the minimization of stops, delays, fuel consumption and air pollution emissions and the maximization of progressive movement through a system or corridor.

FISCAL IMPACT / COST: None. The additional \$1,765,000 are Federal funds and are 100% reimbursable.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: The addition of these funds will allow the Department of Public Works to retime traffic signals within the City's limit.

BUDGET AMENDMENT NECESSARY: Yes. This request amends the Adopted FY2023-27 Capital Improvement Program (CIP), and create a new award number.

REVENUE TO CITY: \$1,765,000 reimbursable state funds.
