WHEREAS, the Council supported the development of a Vision Zero traffic safety program in the City of Richmond by Resolution No. 2016-R011, adopted March 7, 2016, and reaffirmed its support through Resolution No. 2017-R093, adopted March 12, 2018, to reduce traffic fatalities and serious injuries in road traffic to zero by the year 2030, through comprehensive planning including promoting improvements in surface transportation performance and safety for travelers; and

WHEREAS, the Council believes that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Richmond that the Council request that the Chief Administrative Officer cause the preparation of an analysis for public review of the existing infrastructure along the proposed "North/South BRT" corridors for the purpose of ensuring that citizens residing south of the James River have safe and serviceable access to existing and future public transit networks;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND:

That the Chief Administrative Officer is requested to cause the preparation of an analysis for public review of the existing infrastructure along the proposed "North/South BRT" corridors for the purpose of ensuring that citizens residing south of the James River have safe and serviceable access to existing and future public transit networks that includes consideration of the following:

1. Adequate stormwater infrastructure.
2. Tree canopy improvements.
3. Street lighting.
4. Crosswalks.
5. Sidewalks.
6. Bicycle support.

7. Bus stop enhancements in alignment with the City's Complete Streets Policy, adopted by Resolution No. 2014-R172-170, adopted October 13, 2014, and the City's Vision Zero traffic safety program, which the Council supported by Resolution No. 2016-R011, adopted March


7, 2016, and for which the Council reaffirmed its support through Resolution No. 2017-R093, adopted March 12, 2018.

8. The implementation of high frequency public transit on Midlothian Turnpike and Hull Street.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the Council also hereby requests that the Chief Administrative Officer designate the appropriate City personnel to work with the Central Virginia Transportation Authority, the Richmond Regional Planning District Commission, the Virginia Department of Transportation, the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation, and the Commonwealth Transportation Board to identify best planning practices and primary funding sources for the expedient implementation of projects that ensure that citizens residing south of the James River have safe and serviceable access to existing and future public transit networks that include consideration of the items outlined in this resolution.

**ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY**

Requesting that the CAO have an analysis of existing infrastructure along proposed North/South BRT corridors prepared for public review, to ensure that Southside residents have safe and useful access to existing and future public transit networks.

The analysis should include at minimum a review of the following: 1) adequate storm water infrastructure; 2) tree canopy improvements; 3) street lighting; 4) crosswalks; 5) sidewalks; 6) bicycle support; 7) bus stop enhancements in reflection of the City's adoption of Complete Streets and Vision Zero guidelines; and 8) include high frequency public transit (15 minute) on Midlothian Turnpike and Hull Street, in support.

Finally, the legislation should include requests that City staff be designated to work with CVTA, PlanRVA, VDOT, DRPT, and CTB to identify planning best practices and primary funding sources for expedient implementation of these goals.

#### BACKGROUND

The City Council has adopted a number of plans and goals improve public transit and mobility in traffic in the City including Vision Zero, the Master Plan, and Complete Street goals. It is hope that this legislation moves the City toward achieving its goals.
