PURPOSE: To amend the City Council's approval for the City of Richmond participating and supporting the proposed projects related to the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) Round 5 Smart Scale Program, and to authorize Chief Administrative Officer or his designee, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute all necessary City/State agreements relating to such.

REASON: An approved Council Resolution indicating the Council's request for participation and support of the identified potential projects is required in order to participate in the VDOT Round 5 Smart Scale Program.

RECOMMENDATION: The Department of Public Works recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND: The General Assembly directed VDOT to establish several initiatives aimed at accelerating road construction and providing funding assistance for the improvements to their transportation system. One such initiative is the Smart Scale Program; under which the City of Richmond is eligible to apply for funding request of transportation projects. The City has successfully applied for these funds every year since the program's inception.



DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

An amended City Council resolution in support of the proposed projects (attached) is required to participate in the program to accommodate joint applications between the City of Richmond and Henrico County as well as between the City of Richmond and Chesterfield County, where the partnering jurisdictions are submitting applications on the City's behalf. The program will provide for design and construction of certain eligible transportation projects within the City. A formal City/State agreement authorized by the City Council is required before the Virginia Department of Transportation, Henrico County, Chesterfield County or the City can begin design and construction of the approved projects. This is 100% federal reimbursable program that requires no City match. If approved, project funding will be provided starting FY28/FY29. Smart Scale Program is a biennial process.

Virginia's SMART SCALE (§33.2-21.4) is about picking the right transportation projects for funding and ensuring the best use of limited tax dollars. It is the method of scoring planned projects included in VTrans 2040 (Commonwealth's long range transportation plan) that are funded by HB 1887. Transportation projects are scored based on an objective, outcome- based process that is transparent to the public and allows decision-makers to be held accountable to taxpayers. Once projects are scored and prioritized, the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) has the best information possible to select the right projects for funding. More information about the SMART SCALE project prioritization process, including a technical guide for applicants, is available at www.vasmartscale.org.

VDOT's Smart Scale program has provided approximately \$228M in the first four rounds of the program (FY16 – approx. \$68 million for 9 projects, FY17 – approx. \$49 million for 6 projects, FY19 – approx. \$26 million for 7 projects, FY21 – approx. \$85 million for 6 projects). No city match is required; however, leveraged funds boost the ranking as the City projects compete with other jurisdictions in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The amended Round 5 list has the original potential ten projects (attached) is estimated at \$123 million (estimated cost may change after VDOT review and with the use of VDOT project estimating software) as well as one joint project with Chesterfield County and three joint projects with Henrico County.

The deadline to submit the City's applications to participate in the Round 5 Smart Scale Program is August 1, 2022. CTB will adopt and fund projects in June 2023.

FISCAL IMPACT / COST: None.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: Not participating in this program eliminates the possibility of receiving additional Smart Scale Program funding for these important Capital Improvement Projects.

Board Action Requested:

The Board is requested to adopt the resolution endorsing candidate Smart Scale projects and authorize staff to submit the specified projects for Smart Scale funding.

Summary of Information:

In December 2021, the Board adopted a priority list of projects and authorized staff to submit projects for Smart Scale funding consideration. Smart Scale pre-applications were due April 1, 2022. In mid-March 2022, staff was notified that four of the Smart Scale candidate projects were selected for revenue sharing funding. In addition, one of the candidate projects was determined to be ineligible. Another project was determined to be too costly to be competitive in Smart Scale. In order to submit the maximum number of pre-applications, staff selected replacement projects which would compete well in the Smart Scale process. Attachment A reflects the changes to the candidate Smart Scale projects. The new projects are shown in italics.

Pre-applications have been proposed for the twelve projects in bold on Attachment A. Only ten final applications may be submitted. Final applications are due August 1, 2022.

Pre-screening results from the state's Office of Intermodal Planning and Investment (OIPI) have not been received at this time. Staff recommends the twelve projects be prioritized as shown on Attachment A, noted as "# - County". Staff recommends the Board adopt the resolution endorsing all the Smart Scale projects (Attachment B) and authorize staff to submit final applications for the top ten "county" Smart Scale projects that OIPI determines to be eligible.

RESOLUTION - Authorizing County Manager to Submit Eighth Amended Henrico County FY 2019-20 Annual Consolidated Action Plan and to Execute Contracts for CDBG Activities.

This Board paper would authorize the County Manager to submit an eighth amended Henrico County Annual Consolidated Action Plan for FY 2019-20 to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development to allocate \$200,000 in CDBG funds for needs assessment and assistance to persons residing in hotels as primary housing. These funds were allocated to Henrico County by the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) and are subject to an expenditure deadline of May 2026.

The Board paper also authorizes the County Manager to execute contracts with subrecipients to perform activities using these funds.

The Director of Community Revitalization recommends approval of the Board paper, and the County Manager concurs.

RESOLUTION - Appropriation of Funds for FY 2022-23 and Approval of Meals Tax Capital Projects for Henrico County Public Schools.

This Board paper appropriates funds for FY 2022-23 to allow the expenditure of funds budgeted in the County's Annual Fiscal Plans. The Board of Supervisors approved the FY 2022-23 Annual Fiscal Plan on April 12, 2022.

This Board paper also reappropriates to Fiscal Year 2022-23 (i) funds for ongoing capital projects, (ii) funds budgeted in Fiscal Year 2021-22 for the long-term disability benefit program, (iii) funds for all valid outstanding encumbrances as of June 30, 2022, (iv) funds within the Special Revenue Fund for grant programs and donations for specific purposes

that extend beyond June 30, 2022, and (v) all unspent asset forfeiture funds within the Special Revenue Fund. These funds are reappropriated to the same department and account for which they were originally appropriated or encumbered.

This Board paper also approves a project-by-project list of capital projects for Henrico County Public Schools to be funded with meals tax resources in the capital budget.

The Director of Finance recommends approval of the Board paper, and the County Manager concurs.

INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE - To Reduce the Effective Tax Rate for Qualifying Vehicles in 2022 by Returning Surplus Personal Property Tax Revenues for Qualifying Vehicles to Taxpayers.

This Board paper would introduce for advertisement and a public hearing on July 26, 2022, an ordinance to reduce the effective personal property tax rate for qualifying vehicles from \$3.50 to \$2.98 per \$100 of assessed value for 2022. The tax rate would be reduced by providing taxpayers a credit of \$0.52 per \$100 of assessed value for qualifying vehicles assessed personal property taxes for some or all of 2022. The credit would be provided from surplus personal property tax revenues for FY 2021-22 and reflected on the second-half installment bills due on December 5, 2022. Credits may also be applied to supplemental bills after December 5 when appropriate.

Under the ordinance, qualifying vehicles include automobiles, trucks, and motorcycles classified by Section 58.1-3503(A)(3), (4), (5), and (10) of the Code of Virginia and assessed personal property taxes in the County for some or all of 2022. Qualifying vehicles would not include tax-exempt vehicles or vehicles taxed at a rate of \$1.00 or less per \$100 of assessed value.

The Director of Finance recommends approval of the Board paper, and the County Manager concurs.

RESOLUTION - Signatory Authority - Agreement with Richmond Metropolitan Habitat for Humanity - 408 Dakar Drive - Varina District.

This Board paper authorizes the County Manager to execute an agreement to provide funding totaling \$71,500 to Richmond Metropolitan Habitat for Humanity, which will construct and sell a single-family house at 408 Dakar Drive in the Woodlawn Terrace subdivision. Richmond Metropolitan Habitat for Humanity is a non-profit corporation providing services and programs to residents in Central Virginia, including the County.

The lot has been undeveloped dating back to at least 1942, and the construction of a new home in this area will improve the community and its vitality.

The Director of Community Revitalization recommends approval of this Board paper, and the County Manager concurs.

RESOLUTION - Endorsement and Authorization to Submit Letter of Intent to Participate in Virginia Department of Transportation SMART SCALE Program for FY 2024.

This Board paper would authorize the Director of Public Works to submit a letter of intent to participate in the SMART SCALE Program of the Virginia Department of Transportation for FY 2024. The program allocates funds for transportation projects such as highway improvements, transit and rail capacity expansion, bicycle and pedestrian improvements, and transportation demand management.

The County has identified 21 potential projects that are eligible for applications to the SMART SCALE funding program:

- 1. Broad Street Streetscape with Pulse BRT Expansion Phase III Libbie Avenue to Commonwealth Avenue;
- 2. Brook Road Improvements Azalea Avenue to Brook Run Shopping Center; Carolina Avenue Improvements – Laburnum Avenue to Richmond-Henrico Turnpike;
- 3. E. Parham Road Improvements I-95 to Cleveland Street;
- 4. Gaskins Road Interchange at I-64 (Northern Quadrant & Auxiliary Lanes);
- 5. Gaskins Road Interchange at I-64 (Southwestern Quadrant Partial Cloverleaf);
- 6. Glenside Drive/Horsepen Road Safety Improvements;
- 7. Nine Mile Road Gordon Lane to Dabbs House Road;
- 8. Nine Mile Road Dabbs House Road to Laburnum Avenue;
- 9. Parham Road Pedestrian Improvements Holly Hill Road to Three Chopt Road;
- 10. Route 250 at Route 288 Interchange Improvements;
- 11. Route 360/I-64 Interchange Reconfiguration;
- 12. Route 60/Route 33/Beulah Road Roundabout and Gateway Project;
- 13. S. Laburnum Avenue and Gay Avenue Intersection Improvements;
- 14. S. Laburnum Avenue Pedestrian Improvements Thornhurst Street to Gay Avenue;
- 15. Springfield Road Improvements Francistown Road to Staples Mill Road;
- 16. Staples Mill Road Improvements Aspen Avenue to Waller Road;
- 17. W. Broad Street/ Parham Road Intersection Improvements;
- 18. W. Broad Street Pedestrian and Transit Stop Improvements Forest Avenue to Willow Lawn Drive:
- 19. W. Broad Street Short Pump;
- 20. Williamsburg Road Randall Avenue to Charles City Road

To participate in the Program, the Board must authorize staff to submit these projects for funding and pass a resolution endorsing the specified projects.

The Director of Public Works recommends approval of this Board paper, and the County Manager concurs.

RESOLUTION - Award of Contract - Mill Road Improvements - Brookland District.

This Board paper awards a unit price contract for \$704,308.21 to Blakemore Construction Corp. for the Mill Road Improvements project. The project consists of road widening,

restriping, sidewalk improvements, drainage improvements, and a concrete entrance along Mill Road.

Work on the project is anticipated to begin July 2022 and be completed within 120 calendar days.

The County received 5 bids on June 21, 2022, in response to ITB No. 22-2360-5JOK. The bids were as follows:

Based upon a review of the bids, **Blakemore Construction Corp.** is the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

The final contract amount shall be determined upon completion of the project by multiplying the unit quantities authorized by the County by the unit prices submitted in the contractor's bid, plus any earned incentive amount, up to, but not exceeding \$60,000, for early completion of the interim milestone to complete all roadway paving and associated work.

Funding to support the contract is available within the project budget. The Director of Public Works and the Purchasing Director recommend approval of the Board paper, and the County Manager concurs.
