RICHMOND OFFICIAL JOINT PROCLAMATION

By virtue of the authority vested in the United States of America, Commonwealth of Virginia, Virginia Code of Laws, and the Richmond City Charter: The Honorable Levar M. Stoney, Mayor of Richmond, and Richmond City Council, the governing legislative institution of Richmond, Virginia, in the United States of America, do hereby and officially proclaim:

Richmond Indigenous Peoples' Day

Whereas, The Honorable Levar M. Stoney, Mayor of Richmond, and Richmond City Council, the governing legislative institution of Richmond, Virginia, in the United States of America, do hereby unite in common purpose to affirm that what is now known as Richmond was home to Powhatan (Algonquian) peoples who were well established on their ancestral lands long before English colonial arrival in 1607, and that indigenous peoples have been living in what is now Virginia dating back 22,000 years; and

Whereas, Virginia's present geographical boundaries include the Cheroenhaka (Nottoway) Indian Tribe, Chickahominy Indian Tribe, Chickahominy Indians Eastern Division, Mattaponi Indian Tribe, Monacan Indian Nation, Nansemond Indian Tribe, Nottoway Indian Tribe of Virginia, Pamunkey Indian Tribe, Patawomeck Indian Tribe of Virginia, Rappahannock Tribe, and the Upper Mattaponi Indian Tribe, and, prior to colonization, included lands enjoyed by many other Indigenous Peoples, including Shawnee and Cherokee; and

Whereas, Indigenous peoples contributed significantly to the survival and prosperity of English colonial peoples during the early years of their arrival through hospitality, life-saving food, and assistance to the Jamestown settlement, which is considered the birthplace of America; and

Whereas, The subsequent journey and history of Virginia's first residents over the past 400 years has been subject to immense trials, tribulation, and hardships and their determination and perseverance is a testament to the human spirit and their fortitude, dignity, and majesty; and

Whereas, A growing number of Richmond and Virginia residents are of Indigenous descent; and

Whereas, In 2019, in order to honor Indigenous Peoples living in our community and acknowledge the City of Richmond being founded and built upon lands of the Indigenous Peoples of this region, Mayor Levar M. Stoney proclaimed and began recognizing the second Monday in October as Indigenous Peoples' Day, which was followed in 2020 by former Virginia Governor Ralph Northam proclaiming it on behalf of Virginia, and in 2021 by President Joe Biden on behalf of our Nation; and

Whereas, Richmond has great respect and veneration for Indigenous Peoples and their resolve and cultural vibrancy and for the important roles and tremendous contributions they have made with distinction and honor throughout history and continue to make in public service, scholarship, arts, industry, and countless other fields of human endeavor that are integral to the enduring progressive moral arc of our society, humanity, and universe;

Now, Therefore, With the deepest respect, honor, and reverence on behalf of Richmond's first residents, Richmond City Council and Mayor Levar M. Stoney do hereby jointly and officially proclaim, establish and recognize the second Monday in October annually, to be known as **Richmond Indigenous Peoples' Day**, in perpetuity, in continuing to help build a more inclusive and equitable city and encouraging a more complete historical narrative of our collective history.


