**PURPOSE:** Authorizing the City Administration to accept the award from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs grant in the amount of One Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$150,000.00) dollars and appropriating the increase to Special Fund (01601 Cost Center) for the Richmond City Sheriff's Office (RCSO).

**REASON:** The Richmond City Sheriff's Office seeks approval for funds in the amount of \$150,000.00 awarded by the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs for the Bureau of Justice Assistance for the FY 2022 'The Kevin and Avonte Program: Reducing Injury and Death of Missing Individuals with Dementia and Developmental Disabilities' Grant Award

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that this funding be accepted and appropriated to the Richmond City Sheriff's Office effective Fiscal Year 2023.

O&R Request

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**BACKGROUND:** the Richmond City Sheriff's Office (RCSO) currently participates in two programs. The first program is National Project Lifesaver Program, which is free of charge to all city residents who are registered caretakers of individuals who suffer from dementia, autism, or other cognitive conditions which may lead to wandering away from homes and caregivers. The other existing program is the "ARE YOU OK?" Program, which is also a free program to the community, designed to check on the well-being of elderly individuals and those with disabilities as well as shut-in's who live alone. The RCSO staff regularly visits and calls the participants. Although both programs are free to participants, there is a financial impact to the RCSO due to personnel, transportation, and marketing materials. The RCSO needs to grow and enhance the programs based on the growing needs of the community. The RCSO also seeks to develop an internal program that begins with an assessment at intake and includes services for the inmate addressing their condition (cognitive impairment) while they are housed at the Richmond City Justice Center.

**FISCAL IMPACT / COST:** The total amount of this award is \$150,000.00 The Richmond City Sheriff's Office will use the funding for assistance with enhancing the existing programs and developing the new, internal program. *There is no cash match requirement*.

**FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:** The acceptance of this award will allow the Richmond City Sheriff's Office to establish and/or enhance comprehensive, locally based, proactive programs to locate or prevent the wandering of individuals with forms of dementia, or developmental disabilities. This will be a great benefit to the Sheriff's Office and the City as the program seeks to 1) increase public awareness of missing persons with forms of dementia, 2) provide training to families or guardians of individuals who might wander from a safe environment, and 3) establish partnerships in an effort to prevent persons with cognitive disabilities from wandering and 4) establish early detection of cognitive impairment in the Richmond City Justice Center

**BUDGET AMENDMENT NECESSARY:** Yes, the Special Funds Budget must be amended/created for this Grant.

**REVENUE TO CITY:** A drawdown of Grant funds will be completed every quarter to not exceed \$150,000.00 from October 2022 through September 2024 (unless the grant is extended) from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, and Bureau of Justice Assistance. The funds will be appropriated to the Special Fund for this Grant line starting in fiscal year 2023.
