Reappropriation of funds to Reserve for Children's Fund

RE:

PURPOSE: To amend the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 General Fund Non-Departmental Agency Budget by reducing the amount appropriated to the "Neighborhood Resource Center, Inc., Fulton" line item by \$36,000 and re-appropriating these funds to the "Reserve for the Children's Fund" line item.

REASON: The Neighborhood Resource Center of Greater Fulton ("Neighborhood Resource Center, Inc., Fulton") has communicated to City representatives that they will not accept City funds because they are no longer operating youth out-of-school time programs. Funds appropriated to NRC should be re-appropriated to the Children's Fund so that they are available for other youth programming needs.

RECOMMENDATION: The Office of Children and Families recommends approval of this ordinance.

BACKGROUND: The Fiscal Year 2022-2023 General Fund Budget included, for the first time, a new line item in the Non-Departmental agency called "Reserve for the Children's Fund". The intent of this line item was to ensure that the City has the capacity to respond to unanticipated

departmental grantee declines to accept City funds or does not accept the full amount appropriated to them, unused funds can be reallocated to the Children's Fund to support other needs pertinent to children across the City.

During the summer of 2022, Neighborhood Resource Center of Greater Fulton, one of the community organizations included in the Human Services Non-Departmental budget, notified City staff that they would not be continuing their programs and so would not be executing a grant contract for the funds appropriated to their organization in the FY23 GF budget. Additionally, in July, the Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities broke ground on an expansion to Powhatan Community Center; for the duration of this project, the community center is not offering youth programs. There exists a dearth of positive youth development activities within the greater Fulton area, and so the Office of Children and Families has been collaborating with key stakeholders to identify opportunities to increase out-of-school time opportunities in the neighborhood; should opportunities become available, then the Children's Fund will be the funding source to support them, with administration and Council approval.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: This will reduce the Neighborhood Resource Center, Inc., Fulton appropriation in the Non-Departmental budget by \$36,000 and increase the Reserve for Children's Fund appropriation by \$36,000
