Eva Colen, Manager of the Office of Children and Families, provided information about Ord. 2022-373 and 2022-374, and stated that they are grants funded by the American Rescue Plan Act childcare and families supports category. She also stated that the third paper for consideration, Ord. 2023-011, is a grant from the Virginia Department of Transportation for the Safe Routes to School program.

Dominic Barrett, Office of Human Services Strategic Projects and Grants Advisor, provided additional information regarding Ord. 2023-014 through Ord. 2023-020. Mr. Barrett stated that the ordinances were all part of the grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, which awarded the city \$4,000,000 for health literacy programs.

There were no further comments or discussions and Vice Chair Cynthia Newbille moved to forward Ord. 2022-373, 2022-374, 2023-011, 2023-012, 2023-013, 2023-014, 2023-015, 2023-016, 2023-017, 2023-018, 2023-019, and 2023-020 to Council with a recommendation to approve, which was seconded and approved. Ayes 2 Newbille, Lynch, Noes None. Addison had not yet arrived.

Presentation(s)

Homeless Shelters

Dianne Wilmore, Homeless Services Liaison, Department of Human Services, provided the committee with an update on the city's homeless shelters and warming shelters.

Member Andreas Addison arrived at 2:17 p.m. and was seated.

Chair Stephanie Lynch stated that in the future, the city should have an emergency preparedness plan in place to provide emergency shelter services from dedicated staff. Chair Lynch thanked Ms. Wilmore for her hard work and dedication.

Vice Chair Cynthia Newbille expressed her gratitude to Ms. Wilmore for all her work with the homeless shelters and for her leadership.

Chair Lynch had further discussion with Dianne Wilmore regarding the future of the homeless shelters including the resources and funding for the shelters.

Discussion Item(s)

Enrichmond Update

Dominic Barrett, Office of Human Services Strategic Projects and Grants Advisor, advised the committee that the Human Services Department will continue to support the efforts of projects and groups impacted from Enrichmond's dissolution. Mr. Barrett informed the committee that he was present to capture notes and questions from the committee and citizens regarding Enrichmond, and provide them to city administration for responses.

Member Andreas Addison asked what the course is moving forward with projects and funding, and if there will be another organization that can take care of the needs of each community.

Mr. Barrett stated he would bring Mr. Addison's question to the administration, and that he knew that there had been conversations about new and current foundations or fiscal agents that could help.

Chair Stephanie Lynch stated to be mindful of the smaller organizations that do not have non-profit status or affiliation with Enrichmond.

Vice Chair Cynthia Newbille agreed with Chair Lynch regarding the smaller organizations' need for assistance and guidance. She stated that the organizations are seeking funding but do not have a non-profit status.

The committee had further discussion with Dominic Barrett regarding funding for smaller organizations, and Ms. Lynch noted the Enrichmond discussion item will be a regular agenda item at future meetings.
