


During the 2017/2018 school year at Wilder Middle School we had a Dean of Students, Coach Bailey. This school year was different than previous school years due to the presence of Coach Bailey. The revolving door, or repeat offenders within Wilder Middle School appeared to vanish with the deescalation skills taught by Coach Bailey, I was hearing radio traffic of students making the choice to talk issues out with Coach vs. resulting to a fist fight. During this school year, I had the opportunity to participate in the "Dean Team" assemblies and have dialog with the students about making the right choice, the students trusted Coach and were seeing other options to deal with conflict. Coach Bailey never wavered from the goals/objectives, and his teachings were making an impact on the student population. I think his calm demeanor helped gain the trust of these students who may not have anyone in their life like him. One last thing about Coach Bailey, he always liked to involve the SRO while talking to the students, not to scare them but to allow the SRO to build a relationship with the student and mentor them as well. I personally have relationships with Wilder students because of Coach Bailey. Coach Bailey's Life Skills would be beneficial to all students. These life skills are not genetic traits, they have to be taught and seeing what impact it had in Wilder for one school year, I could only imagine the impact of several years.

At the start of the building mindful learners' program, we had the students and staff come up with 3 positive affirmations to say to themselves every morning to start the day. I personally have added "be coachable" and "be you" to my daily affirmations. Thank you so much for coming to speak with us and "giving us a bring" to help build ourselves."
