EXPEDITED CONSIDERATION

1. To designate the property known as 1717 Bellevue Avenue as a revitalization area pursuant to Va. Code § 36-55.30:2. (Ms. Jordan and Ms. Lambert)
2. To appoint Kennon C. Wright to the position of Council Liaison. (President Jones)

ORDINANCES

3. To amend Ord. No. 2022-055, adopted May 9, 2022, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 General Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, to (i) re-appropriate \$1,752,480.00 of the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 fund balance excess identified in the Fiscal Year 2022 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report as a Special Purpose assignment (ii) create a new line item entitled “Great Aspirations Scholarship Program, Inc. (Pathways Program – Great Aspirations Scholarship Program)” in the Non-Departmental Agency, and (iii) appropriate such \$1,752,480.00 to such new line item in the Non-Departmental agency, for the purpose of funding the creation of the Pathways Program for new Richmond Public Schools’ graduates. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
4. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$12,882.00 from the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles and to appropriate the increase to the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Police’s DMV Traffic Enforcement and Safety Initiative Special Fund by \$12,882.00 for the purpose of funding police traffic enforcement and safety initiatives in the city of Richmond. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
5. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$50,000.00 from the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services, and to appropriate the increase to the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Special Fund Budget by increasing estimated revenues and the amount appropriated to the Department of Police’s Department of Criminal Justice Services Special Fund by \$50,000.00, for the purpose of supporting law enforcement training to reduce violent crime in the city of Richmond. **{No Committee – Rule VI(B)(3)(c)}**
6. To amend Ord. No. 2022-055, adopted May 9, 2022, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 General Fund Budget and made appropriations pursuant thereto, to (i) transfer \$75,000.00 from the Department of Public Works agency (ii) create a new line item entitled “Venture Richmond Inc. (Graffiti Removal - Downtown)” in the Non-

Departmental agency, and (iii) appropriate such \$75,000.00 to such new line item in the Non-Departmental agency, for the purpose of funding graffiti removal in the downtown service area. **{Finance and Economic Development – March 16, 2023}**

7. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a Cooperation Agreement between the City of Richmond and the Economic Development Authority of the City of Richmond, Virginia for the purpose of providing grants and technical assistance to small businesses in the city of Richmond. **{Finance and Economic Development – March 16, 2023}**
8. To amend City Code §§ 2-1187, concerning the creation of the History and Culture Commission, 2-1188, concerning composition, 2-1189, concerning qualifications, 2-1191, concerning duties, and 2-1192, concerning administration. **{Governmental Operations – March 22, 2023}**
9. To amend Ord. No. 2022-104, adopted April 25, 2022, as previously amended by Ord. No. 2022-243, adopted Sept. 12, 2022, which authorized the Chief Administrative Officer to issue grants, loans, or a combination thereof from the City's 1st Tranche of American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 funds to certain entities in designated amounts and authorized the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City, to execute all necessary documents to affect such issuance for the purpose of financing the construction and preservation of single-family and multifamily dwellings, to provide for a revised list of entities eligible for the issuance of such grants, loans, or a combination thereof. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – March 23, 2023}**
10. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a Deed of Quitclaim of Utility Easement between the City of Richmond and Roane Atlantic LLC, for the purpose of vacating by quitclaim deed certain easements on the property known as 1809 Roane Street, for nominal consideration, to Roane Atlantic LLC. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – March 23, 2023}**
11. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to submit a HOME – ARP Allocation Plan to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the receipt of Home Investment Partnerships – American Rescue Plan (HOME - ARP) Program funds in the amount of \$5,840,854.00. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – March 23, 2023}**
12. To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer, for and on behalf of the City of Richmond, to execute a City of Richmond Grant Contract between the City of Richmond and the James River Association to provide funding for the implementation of green infrastructure improvements to increase stormwater management at a certain library of the City known as the East End Branch located at 1200 North 25th Street. **{Land Use, Housing and Transportation – March 23, 2023}**

13. To authorize the special use of the property known as 708 China Street for the purpose of a two-family detached dwelling, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – April 3, 2023}**
14. To amend and reordain Ord. No. 97-370-351, adopted Dec. 15, 1997, which authorized the property known as 701 German School Road for the purpose of authorizing an existing radio broadcast studio and office tower and the replacement of an existing telecommunications tower with a new tower of increased height, to remove the limitation on the number of permitted wireless communications providers, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – April 3, 2023}**
15. To amend and reordain Ord. No. 2018-310, adopted Dec. 17, 2018, which authorized the special use of the property known as 2712 East Leigh Street for the purpose of up to seven multifamily dwelling units and an accessory office, to authorize certain uses permitted on corner lots within the R-63 Multifamily Urban Residential District, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – April 3, 2023}**
16. To authorize the special use of the properties known as 2100 Newbourne Street, 2102 Newbourne Street, and 2104 Newbourne Street for the purpose of up to three two-family detached dwellings, upon certain terms and conditions. (Mayor Stoney – By Request) **{Planning Commission – April 3, 2023}**
17. To authorize the special use of the properties known as 2110 Newbourne Street, 2112 Newbourne Street, 2112 ½ Newbourne Street, and 2114 Newbourne Street for the purpose of up to four two-family detached dwellings, upon certain terms and conditions.
