PURPOSE: To amend Ord. No. 2022-055, adopted May 9, 2022, which adopted the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 General Fund Non-Departmental Budget Agency budget by reducing the amount appropriated to the Non-Departmental agency, Reserve for Children's Fund line item by \$250,000 and appropriating these funds to a new Non-Departmental budget line item titled YWCA Richmond – Sprout School.

REASON: With this \$250,000 allocation from the City's Non-Departmental agency, Reserve for Children's Fund, the City will partner with the YWCA Richmond to help open a new Sprout

School in the Oregon Hill neighborhood. This \$250,000 will cover one-time capital costs.

RECOMMENDATION: The administration recommends approval

BACKGROUND: Sprout Schools provide full-day, high-quality early childhood education for children ages two months to five years – regardless of income. This new school will be able to serve an additional 60 kids and will open summer 2023.

Non-Departmental Agency, Reserve for Children's Fund

The Non-Departmental Reserve for Children's Fund, managed by our Office of Children and Families, allows us to be responsive to the ever-changing, post-pandemic landscape of out-of-school time — this includes afterschool and summer programs, youth employment opportunities, as well as early childhood programming. Over the past few years, we've learned that it can be hard to predict funding needs for these priorities, but they've been more important than ever before as we support our families to get back to work and recover from the pandemic. The Fund will supplement existing non-departmental investments and help us address unexpected needs that would otherwise prevent us from serving as many kids as need out-of-school time programming.

FISCAL IMPACT / COST:

<u>If adopted:</u> The City will be able to utilize \$250,000 in funding from the Reserve for Children's Fund.

<u>If not adopted:</u> The City will be unable to assist with the expansion of childcare spots for the Sprout School.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: This O&R will reduce the Non-Departmental agency, Reserve for Children's Fund, by \$250,000.
