## Staff Analysis

Paint design guidelines, page 62	Staff representatives of the Commission of Architectural Review (CAR) are authorized to assist Historic District property owners in paint selection, and where appropriate, grant Administrative Approval for paint color proposals	The applicant painted his house dark blue, without approval of CAR.

	Commission staff must approve any new paint colors before work can begin.	
Paint Design Guidelines: HISTORIC MASONRY, page 63.	1) Do not paint historic brick or stone masonry that has not previously been painted. Painting previously unpainted masonry is historically inaccurate and is not permitted. 2) Review is required if you wish to change the color of painted brick. If you wish to paint previously painted brick the same color, no review by staff or CAR is necessary.	Because the building features previously painted masonry, the applicant can paint their house a new color, <u>but the building</u> <u>color should reflect a natural brick color</u> . The guideline keeps a continuity of brick buildings within historic districts.
Paint Design Guidelines: HISTORIC MASONRY, page 63, Masonry Buildings (previously painted only)	3) Colors associated with the colors of natural brick are strongly encouraged and are preferrable to less appropriate colors (white, green, blue). Paint Guide for Body Color- Brick: Reds, Browns, Yellow-Clay.	The applicant proposes repainting the exterior of their house. <u>Since the house</u> was previously painted, the owner could paint the building, but the paint color needs to be approved color found on the CAR Paint Design Guidelines for Masonry Buildings (previously painted only).

It is the assessment of staff that, with the conditions above, the new color of the house is in violation of the Old and Historic District Design Review Guidelines.
