

As the current Chair of the City UDC and as an architect and urban designer who lives and has been working in Richmond for almost 20 years, I have witnessed a renaissance of our city. I would be glad to have an opportunity to continue to serve now that my UDC term is about to end.

Over almost 6 years of service as a member and now as Chair of the UDC, I have found it extremely rewarding to hear the diversity of citizens' opinions regarding projects that have an impact on their lives. I have enjoyed seeing their enthusiasm for new or improved parks, recreation centers, libraries, and infrastructure; I have also heard and valued their concerns, frustrations, and oppositions to projects that could have a negative impact on their communities. As an architect and urban designer, I have enjoyed challenging applicants to listen to the public to improve and question their designs. As a result, during my tenure as member and then as Chair, the UDC approved new guidelines for Universal Accessibility and placemaking; we also addressed environmental concerns over light pollution, use of sustainable principles and materials, and the adoption of native plantings. As Chair, I championed discussions and invited experts to come talk about the concept of placemaking (we hosted Pritti Pattel from Project of Public Spaces, for example); I also invited city interns to present case studies about what makes for a successful library. In general, I see the UDC as a place for learning, discussion, and the implementation of good urban design.

For over twenty-five years, throughout my professional career, I have been a dedicated urban designer and architect. I have worked on Master Plans for Morehouse College in Atlanta, Bucknell University in PA, and other American schools all over the world. My Urban Design Master of Science thesis was about the sustainable development of tourism in medium-sized historic towns, a topic that led to a publication in the journal Urban Design International. As an architect I have worked on prestigious projects for Cornell, Yale, Middlebury, and Duke Universities, as well as on key projects for the city of Richmond, such as the VMFA expansion and the Main Street Station renovation. As a Senior Associate Architect at Quinn Evans, I have worked on award-winning projects such as the Libbie Mill, Varina and Fairfield libraries in Henrico County and the Atlee Library in Hanover: these are all public projects that have clearly enhanced the quality of life of

our citizens.

In our community, since I live in the Fan, I have been part of the Fan District Preservation Committee and have therefore worked on the development of a Design Overlay District. I am delighted to hear that this plan might finally be coming to discussion for final implementation. I am also a member of the Design Forum Committee organized by the Virginia American Institute of Architects.

With my broad experience in urban design and architecture, I could offer a holistic analysis of the development of our city, one that would consider its architecture in relation to the surrounding urban space. I also believe that my knowledge of Richmond's local context, combined with my international background, might offer the committee new perspectives and ways to envision the future of our city.

For these reasons, I would like to serve Richmond at large, and would be honored if I could become part of this committee.

The Commission shall consist of **nine (9) members**. The Council shall appoint seven (7) of the members, one of whom must have expertise in urban forestry. The Mayor shall appoint two (2) members, one of whom shall be a city employee in the Department of Public Works or the designee thereof.

Of the remaining members, one member shall be selected from each of the following fields:

- (1) Sustainability.
- (2) Green building practices.
- (3) Energy efficiency.
- (4) Environmental protection.

At least four of the Council appointees shall reside in the city or have their principal place of employment in the city in accordance with section 2-767 of this Code.

The **remaining** Council **appointees and the Mayor's appointee other than the Director of Public Works** or the designee thereof **shall not** be subject to any requirement that they maintain a residence or a principal place of employment in the city. All other aspects of the commission and its membership not addressed in this division shall be governed by Chapter 2, Article V, Division 1 of the City Code.



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Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority

Section 5.05(d) of the Charter of the City of Richmond (2006) expressly provides that "the appointment of members of a redevelopment and housing authority in the city shall be made by the council." Section 36-11 of the Code of Virginia (1950) authorizes the Council to provide for not more than nine or less than five commissioners of the Authority. By Resolution No. 99-R46-80, adopted March 22, 1999, the Council increased the number of commissioners from five to seven as authorized by section 36-11 of the Code of Virginia (1950). Resolution No. 2010-R140-162, adopted October 25, 2010, increased the number of commissioners from seven to nine with the addition of a Council-appointed seat and an additional tenant representative seat.

Pursuant to section 36-11 of the Code of Virginia (1950), no commissioner of the Authority may be an officer or employee of the City. By Resolution No. 2003-R230-2004-R18, adopted January 12, 2004, the Council established a procedure to be followed for appointing one member living in public or assisted housing to serve on the Authority's Board of Commissioners as required by the regulations of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development. This resolution was further amended by Resolution No. 2010-R141-173, adopted November 8, 2010, which revised the process of appointing the tenant representatives to the board.
