PURPOSE: To end local state of emergency declared because of the 2019 Novel Coronavirus pandemic (Resolution No. 2020-R025.)

REASON: Based upon the current COVID-19 trends, the Department of Health and Human Services is planning for the federal Public Health Emergency for COVID-19 is to expire at the end of the day on May 11, 2023.

Because of reduced threats to public health and public safety arising from COVID-19, reduced transmission and community spread of COVID-19, increased COVID-19 vaccination rates, and enhanced capacity to contend with existing infections, the measures originally undertaken in response to the COVID-19 pandemic are deemed no longer necessary, and therefore a state of emergency no longer exists in the City in regard to the 2019 Novel Coronavirus.

The City's termination of the declared emergency relating COVID-19 would coincide with the recession of the Federal declaration.

This resolution should in no way be interpreted to signify that the COVID-19 pandemic is over. The City of Richmond continues to recommend vaccinations and boosters for all who are eligi-

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ble, social distancing measures for those infected or ineligible for vaccination, and all other precautions to reduce transmission and minimize harm from COVID-19 in the community.

RECOMMENDATION: The City Administration recommends adoption.

BACKGROUND: In 2020, the Mayor of the City of Richmond, as the City's Director of Emergency Management, Virginia Code 44.146.19, determined that a local emergency should be declared due to potential threats to public health and public safety arising from expected impacts from the COVID-19 (Coronavirus).

The Virginia Emergency Services and Disaster Law Virginia Code, 44-146.21 provides that the declaration of any emergency by the local Director of Emergency Management is subject to confirmation by the local governing body at its next regularly scheduled meeting or at a special meeting within 45 days of the declaration, whichever occurs first. That, on March 16, 2020, in accordance with section 44-146.21(A) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the Council of the City of Richmond consented to the declaration made by the Mayor of the City of Richmond in his role as Director of Emergency Management that a local emergency existed in the city of Richmond due to the potential spread of the 2019 Novel Coronavirus known as "COVID-19."
