The artist shall be responsible for meeting all the terms of the City contract. The artist will also work with programming staffing at the Center to develop a highly participatory workshop to engage the community and gather input on the sculptures coloring, size and location on the grounds. The artist will also be responsible for treating surfaces for ease of graffiti cleaning and will work with the project's landscape architects to develop a planting scheme that will require no mowing around the sculpture while also complementing the existing planting design.

ARTIST'S QUALIFCATIONS

Sujin Lim was born in 1979 in Seoul, Korea. She has a BFA and MFA in Sculpture from Seoul National University, an MFA in Public Art and New Artistic Strategies from the Bauhaus University in Germany, and has also attended the Kowlheagn School of Painting & Sculpture in Maine. She has had two solo exhibitions in Korea and her works have been selected for exhibitions including At the End of the World in the Marke 6 gallery at the Neues Museum in Germany and Storming Party in Art Museum in the Seoul Museum of Art. She has developed her work at the Changdong Art Studio and the National Museum of Contemporary Art Korea. She has received fellowships from I-park Artists Residency in the USA, Taipei Artist's Village in Taiwan, Villa Sträuli Winterthur in Switzerland, and the Korean Arts Council for her participation in GlogauAIR in Berlin. Her work is included in public collections in Russian, France, Canada, Seoul and multiple cities around the US.
