CHOICE NEIGHBORHOODS OVERVIEW



"The Choice Neighborhoods Initiative will transform distressed neighborhoods... into viable and sustainable mixed-income neighborhoods by linking housing improvements with appropriate services, schools, public assets, transportation, and access to jobs... Choice Neighborhood grants will build upon the successes of public housing transformation under HOPE VI to provide support for the preservation and rehabilitation of public and HUD-assisted housing, within the context of a broader approach to concentrated poverty."

Utilizes the framework of the HOPE VI program, while focusing on the revitalization of the surrounding neighborhoods as well as a public housing site.

CORE GOALS OF CHOICE



Create the conditions necessary for public and private reinvestment in distressed neighborhoods to offer the kinds of amenities and assets, including safety, good schools, and commercial activity, that are important to families' choices about their community.



Improve outcomes of households living in the target housing related to employment and income, health, and children's education.



Replace distressed public and assisted housing with highquality mixed-income housing that is well-managed and responsive to the needs of the surrounding neighborhood.
