To amend City Code § 23-45, concerning refuse collection at a point other than a curb or alley for the elderly and persons with disabilities, for the purpose of authorizing the collection service for as many refuse receptacles as provided by the City.

THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEREBY ORDAINS:

§ 1. That section 23-45 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2020) is hereby **amended** as follows:

Sec. 23-45. Collection at point other than curb or alley for elderly and disabled persons.

If there is no person between the ages of 15 years and 70 years at any residence or if there is no person between such ages physically or mentally capable of placing refuse receptacles at the curb or alley, the City shall provide collection service from a point approved by the Director of Public Works, for as many refuse receptacles as provided by the City to the owner of the premises pursuant to Section 23-72. The Director may require, at least once every two years, evidence of

such physical or mental disability. A certificate by a physician licensed to practice in the State shall be considered as sufficient proof of disability.

§ 2. This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption.

ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

The patron requests that legislation be drafted requiring the collection and emptying of as many refuse receptacles as assigned to the residence under Section 23-45 of the City Code. Section 23-45 allows the collection of refuse receptacles from a point approved by the Director of the Department of Public Works (DPW) for disabled or elderly persons who have difficulty disposing of refuse at the usual collection points assigned by the Department.

BACKGROUND

The patron wishes to amend the City Code so that as many refuse receptacles can be emptied by DPW as are assigned to the residence for disabled and elderly residence who qualify for special consideration in refuse collection pursuant to City Code Section 23-45. DPW

currently operates the “Back Door Program” that assists elderly and disabled residents with collection of a refuse receptacle from a point closer to their home. The city also allows residence to acquire and use additional receptacles when residents pay for them. The patron wishes to ensure the collection of more than one receptacle of a qualifying residence that has more than one receptacle assigned to it.
