

**PURPOSE:** To amend Ordinance No. 2023-071, which adopted the annual budget for Fiscal Year 2024, by authorizing the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$3,320,000.00 from the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) and to appropriate these funds to a newly created special fund account titled "Safer Communities" in the FY24 budget for the Department of Justice Services.

On November 21, 2023, the Richmond Department of Justice Services was awarded these funds to implement Richmond's Safer Communities Program, which involves a collaborative framework between the Richmond Department of Justice Services (DJS), Richmond Police Department (RPD), and the YWCA.

Richmond's Safer Communities Program will allow the City to enhance and improve its response to domestic violence and its short- and long-term effects. Currently, RPD has specific officers assigned to the DI-VERT Team (Domestic Intercession: Violence Elimination Response Team), who collaborate with the leasing offices and numerous services to provide resources to people involved in domestic violence to reduce future occurrences. This funding will help expand their resources to meet the needs of residents experiencing an occurrence of domestic violence.

The YWCA has been identified to assist the City provide community, mental healthcare, and resources for Richmonders that live at the intersection of poverty, violence, and systemic racism. In particular, it will allow the City to prioritize its domestic violence community response after RPD responds to calls in an effort to increase safety planning and decrease recidivism.

The planned activities by the Department of Justice Services (DJS) will be to provide family-centered case management support and therapeutic services to multi-challenged youth and their families who have had justice involvement in order to promote positive family relationships, strengthen protective factors, and reduce the likelihood of future involvement with the justice system, breaking the cycle of generational incarceration. Additionally, DJS will implement a credible messenger program. Using this people-up perspective, the credible messenger approach seeks to build trust and inspire change from within communities so that they can feel positive about possibilities rather than facing a future of frustration. Credible Messengers are often neighborhood leaders, experienced prevention and reentry specialists, and individuals with relevant life experiences (usually including their own involvement with the criminal justice system) who coach, guide and mentor.

The planned activities administered by the Department of Justice Services (DJS) and the Richmond Police Department (RPD) will commence the current fiscal year (Fiscal Year 2024) through Fiscal Year 2026. The initiatives are based on evidence-based practices targeting positive youth development, family engagement and family justice services for victims of domestic violence.

BACKGROUND: Amendments to Governor Glenn Youngkin's approved Fiscal Year 2023 general

fund budget provided \$10,000,000 the second year (Fiscal Year 2024) from the Commonwealth's

general fund for the Safer Communities Program. Created under DCJS, this program is to support

holistic, community-based strategies that address the root causes and conditions of community violence.

Per DCJS's guidelines, such strategies shall be evidence-informed and/or community-driven and shall

include: (i) afterschool programs and mentorships; (ii) connections to education and economic

opportunities; (iii) trauma-informed mental health care; (iv) credible messengers and violence

interrupters; and (v) strategies to build trust between law enforcement agencies and community

stakeholders. Out of this amount, \$9,500,000 was allocated to the City of Norfolk, the City of

Portsmouth, and the City of Richmond, with a minimum award of \$2,500,000 per locality and the

remainder allocated to each of the three localities based on population." On November 21, 2023, the

Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services awarded the City of Richmond \$3,320,000.
