Richmond's fatal overdose rate is 3x the statewide average.

25% of Richmond adults have not seen a doctor for a routine check up in the past year

Hispanic people in Richmond are more than 2x as likely to be food insecure than the average Virginian.

In 2020, the Infant
Mortality rate
amongst Black
Richmonders was 1.7x
the statewide rate.

Black people in Richmond are more than 3x as likely to be food insecure than the average Virginian.

Richmond City was ranked 100 of 133 VA counties for health outcomes

Black Richmonders are 1.35x as likely to die of an opioid overdose than a White Richmonders.

16% of Richmond City Adults lack health insurance.



Examples of HEF Investment Projects



Community 50/50 is expanding its 3rd Sunday feeding program into a full-service health fair offering physical health screenings, mental health screenings, stress management tools, fitness assessments, nutritional counseling, and other resources.



Empowering YOU for Positive Change is implementing a Mental Health Skill Building program servicing residents who lack sufficient health insurance.



Health Brigade is enhancing their integrated primary care services by sustaining and increasing communicable disease testing, treatment, and linkage to care specifically for syphilis, HCV and TB.



Help Me Help You Foundation is hiring essential staff to provide ongoing case management, care coordination, and workshops for justice-involved Richmond residents with a history of substance use.



Latinos in Virginia Empowerment Center is expanding the existing Hotline Team to provide information and support more intentionally to Spanish-speaking individuals, connecting them with the services they need.



Nationz Foundation is improving access to care for STI testing, linking clients to educational resources and care, referring clients to emergency support services, expanding outreach, and providing harm reduction services.



REAL LIFE is providing housing for residents in 9 REAL Houses, which includes support for each Lifer to create a transition plan, in-home pro-social skill building at each house, drug testing, and other support services.



Richmond Food Justice Alliance is facilitating an urban agriculture and skill-building program, food distribution, community events, and workshops with the goal of reducing food insecurity and increasing access to healthy food options and green spaces.



Shalom Farms is offering a more consistent supply of produce and other locally produced healthy foods by increasing the number of Mobile Market days, the duration of the market distribution season, and inclusion of additional marginalized neighborhoods, thus resulting in more residents with long-term, affordable access to high quality, culturally appropriate, fresh food.



St. Luke Legacy Center is filling gaps in their "The Fourth Trimester" program to provide holistic, wraparound support for new and expecting parents with children ages 0-5 that addresses the social, emotional, cognitive, physical, and behavioral aspects of infant and child development while also addressing these same needs for both parents.



The Hive is onboarding Young Innovators as part-time staff members, as well as creating a transition plan for each Young Innovator through goal-setting and case management, resource referral, self-guided and HIVE-facilitated enrichment activities, and monthly life-skills workshops.



Virginia Anti-Violence Project is addressing the strong need for mental health peer to peer support and longer-term emergency services for high-risk LGBTQ+ survivors of violence.



WHO Counseling Services is implementing a Substance Use Disorder Treatment Program for the reentry population who lack sufficient health insurance to cover necessary SUD services.





A frequent market shopper started buying produce for her kids at a parks and rec summer camp she works at. A lot of the kids had never tried peppers or tomatoes! She was saddened by how they brought really unhealthy snacks in, and started giving them fruit and veggies from us. Kids were reluctant at first but then they tried and loved the bell peppers, cucumbers, tomatoes, squash, and fruit. They even made salsa and guacamole using our produce! The kids came for a field trip too!
