UDC Background

The UDC is a ten member committee created by City Council in 1968 whose purpose is to advise the City Planning Commission on the design of projects on City property or right-of-way. The UDC provides advice of an aesthetic nature in connection with the performance of the duties of the Commission under Sections 17.05, 17.06 and 17.07 of the City Charter. The UDC also advises the Department of Public Works in regards to private encroachments in the public right-of-way.

Purpose of the Project

This 5th phase of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Middle School seeks to provide spaces that serve the needs of the surrounding community beyond the educational program of the Middle School. The pre-kindergarten program previously offered at the original MLK MS site was temporarily moved to another site during the demolition and new construction of the new middle school. A new pre-school building on the MLK MS site will allow the City's Head Start and the Virginia Preschool Initiative program to return to the location where it is better able to serve its community.

Project Background

The evaluation of scope and approach for the development of the Pre-Kindergarten began with discussions among the program leadership and the City of Richmond's Chief Capital Projects Manager, the Program Director for Building the Best Richmond (Schools Capital Improvement Program), and Richmond City Public Schools.

The Middle School site is located at the northern corner of Leigh and Mosby Streets in Church Hill at the east end of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Bridge. This location serves as one of the gateways into the City's governmental, historic, and biomedical core from the East End and points east. The properties surrounding the school parcel are largely public housing or subsidized public housing developments with a higher density of owner-occupied single-family housing further east and south. The Pre-Kindergarten will be located to the south-west of the Middle School building with the Leigh Street Viaduct (or Martin Luther King, Jr. Bridge) bordering the site to the South.

Project Budget and Funding Sources

The construction budget for the new Pre-Kindergarten building is approximately \$3,900,000. The project is being funded through the City of Richmond sources.

Description of the Construction Program

Site Plan

The site improvements are designed to create a place which is connected to the community while maximizing safety and security. Public areas and entrances will be defined while maintaining privacy and security of the academic spaces and play areas. The Pre-Kindergarten building will utilize the street entry and parking area at the south end of the Middle School. This lot will incorporate a shared drop-off lane to be used by the Middle School and Pre-Kindergarten. Sidewalks beginning at the intersection of Mosby and P Streets will connect to the Pre-Kindergarten for pedestrian access to the site.

Outdoor Learning and Play Spaces

The Pre-Kindergarten program will include approximately 10,000 SF of outdoor learning and play spaces. Play spaces will be designed to accommodate a combination of play equipment, hard surfaces, and open field area. Play areas will be located to the west of the Pre-Kindergarten building providing separation from the Middle School and parking area. The entire play area will be fenced.

Building Description


The new Pre-Kindergarten building will be approximately 22,000 SF and will accommodate 260 students ages 3-5. The facility will include 13 classrooms, flexible common space learning areas, a multi-purpose room and associated administration spaces. The building will be a masonry and steel structural system with low slope roof areas. Veneer materials will match or complement the new Middle School and utilizes many of the same materials. The exteriors will be clad in a combination of masonry, glass, prefinished metal panels and fiber cement board. The two primary types of masonry will be brick and ground face masonry units.

Sustainability

The Pre-Kindergarten building is being designed to achieve the LEED Silver Certification rating. Strategies that will be pursued include: storm water management, reflective roof surfaces to minimize heat island effects, drought resistant and native plantings, energy efficient, high performing mechanical and electrical systems, and day-lighting and views in regularly occupied spaces.


Construction Start Date

Construction is scheduled to begin in June of 2014 following Phase 4 of the MLK MS project, which consists of the demolition of the remainder of the original school and final site improvements. The Pre-Kindergarten is scheduled to be completed by August of 2015 with final occupancy slated for the Fall Semester of 2015.









BUILDING ELEVATIONS








ENTRY VIEW







REAR PLAY AREA


