- § 2. That the Chief Administrative Officer or the designee thereof is hereby authorized and directed to, within the constraints imposed by this ordinance, (i) acquire, by gift, purchase, condemnation or otherwise, the aforementioned permanent easements, (ii) act for and on behalf of the City of Richmond in agreeing or disagreeing with the owners of the property from whom such permanent easements must be acquired upon the compensation, if any, to be paid therefor, and (iii) execute the deeds and other documents necessary to complete the acquisition and acceptance of such permanent easements, provided that all such deeds and other documents first must be approved as to form by the City Attorney or the designee thereof.
- § 3. That none of the aforementioned permanent easements may be acquired by condemnation proceedings unless and until such condemnation proceedings have been authorized by ordinance adopted by this Council.
 - § 4. This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption.
