Who We Are

The CAR is the city's official historic preservation body and is charged with reviewing all exterior changes to structures within City Old and Historic Districts and issuing Certificates of Appropriateness for those projects that it determines to be appropriate.



Who We Are

The Richmond Commission of Architectural Review (CAR) was established by City Council in 1957.

The first historic district was the St. John's Historic District, created in 1957.

The most recent historic district is the Union Hill Historic District, created in 2009.

Old and Historic Districts are created only by citizen request.



Local Historic Districts in the U.S.

1931: Charleston, SC establishes an "Old and Historic District," administered by a Board of Architectural Review, the first in the U.S.

1936: New Orleans, LA establishes the Vieux Carré Commission

1955: Philadelphia, PA establishes its first local historic preservation ordinance.

1957: Richmond, VA establishes the St. John's Old and Historic District, administered by a Commission of Architectural Review.

1966: The National Historic Preservation Act is passed.

1968: South Carolina legislature approves historic district zoning; Savannah Historic District Board of Review established in 1973.

2015: Over 2,300 local historic districts exist in the U.S.

How do we Function?



The CAR is a ninemember Commission appointed by City Council.

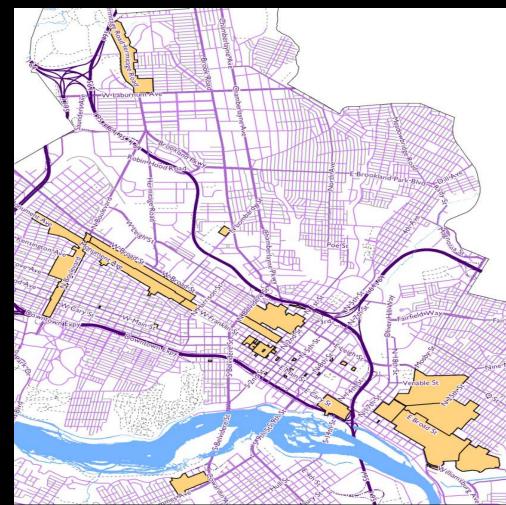
CAR is authorized by Sec. 30-930.3(d) of the City Code to issue or deny certificates of appropriateness for construction, alteration, repair, restoration or demolition within any City Old and Historic District.

16 Districts

Containing 4,006 properties

28 Individual Properties





City Old and Historic Districts

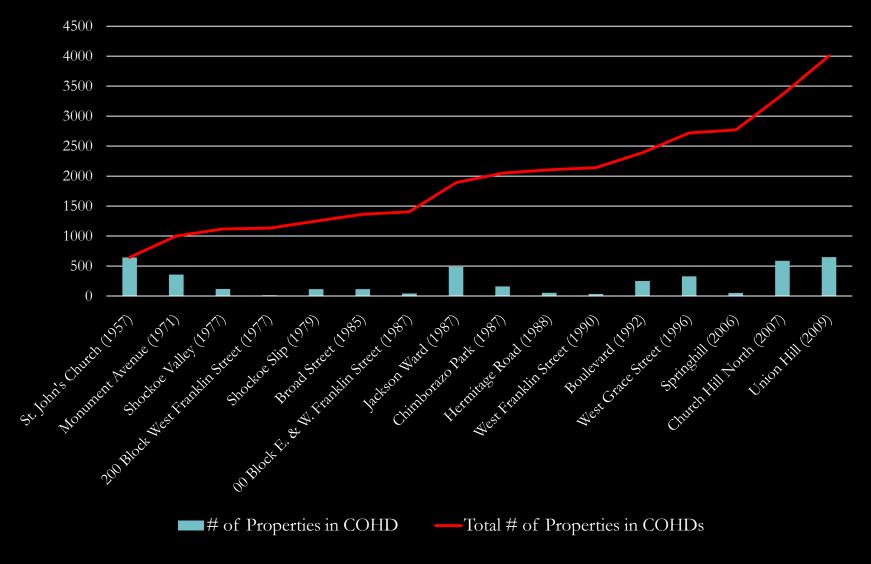
The first historic district was the St. John's Historic District, created in 1957.

In 1957, there was one historic district containing approximately 324 properties*. There were no individual historic properties.

In 2015, there are 16 historic districts containing 4,006 properties. In addition, there are 28 individual historic properties.

* The St. John's Church OHD was amended in 1967, 1977 and 1987 and now contains 643 properties

Growth in Number of Properties in City Old and Historic Districts



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A Citizen-Requested Program

Old and Historic Districts are created only by citizen request. The growth in the number of properties is a reflection of this.

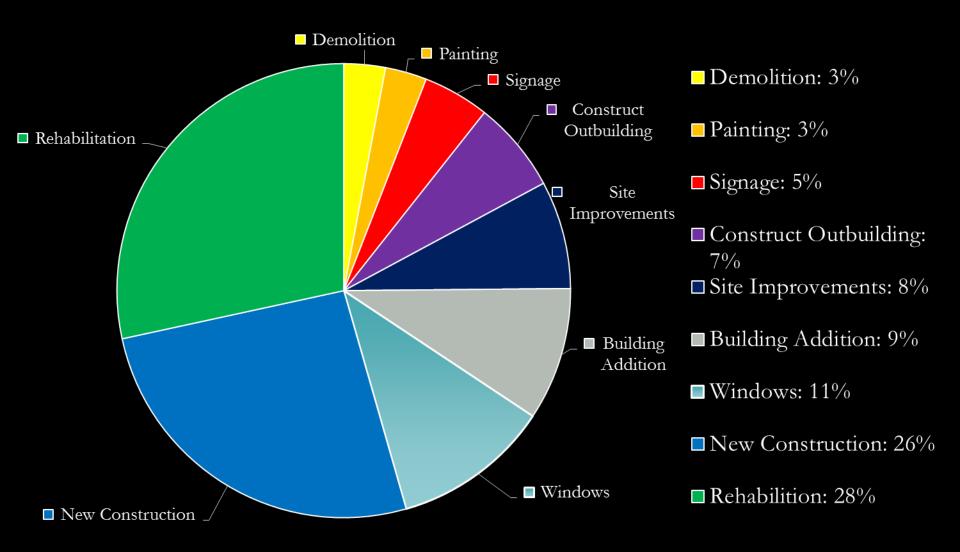
- 1. Residents see the designation as a way to protect the qualities that make their neighborhoods unique.
- 2. They must organize and solidify the support of their neighbors and the city to be designated.
- 3. Once designated they are actively engaged in the enforcement of the guidelines.

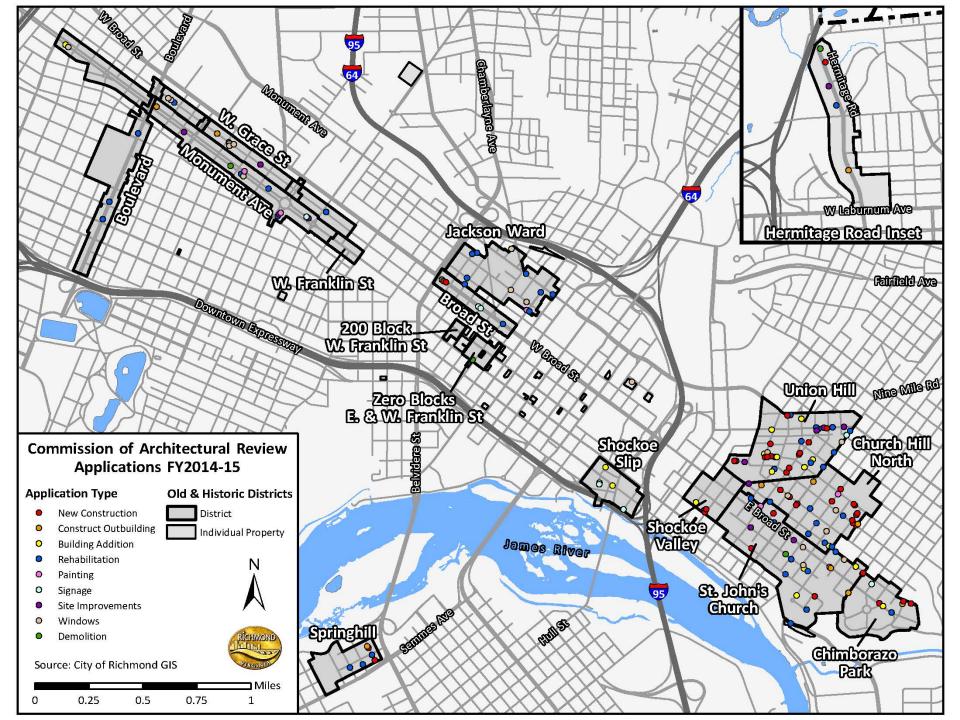

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FY15 Applications by Project Type



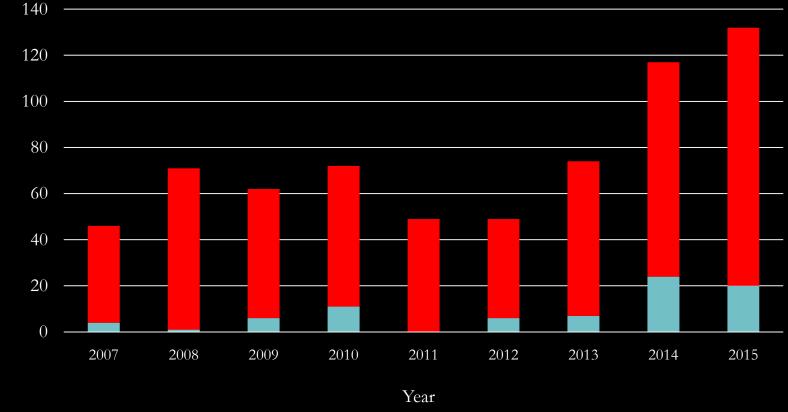


Recent Trends: New Construction

■ New Construction ■ Total Applications

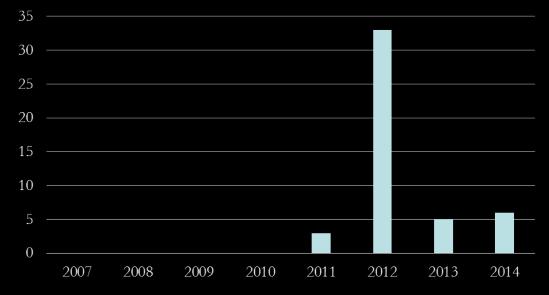
