Existing Conditions*





Live Oak Tree

Planted in 1989

Base of tree approximately 1-1.5' higher than top of curb

Can be trimmed except large, lower branch


No more than one third of circumference of roots under pavers can be cut

Pavers can be replaced







Four Spaces will be lost with closing of Brook Road segment








Pedestrian Push Buttons will be added with BRT project











Vehicular and Pedestrian Traffic Circulation

No sidewalk currently on east side of N. Adams Street


Need to maintain three lanes (two southbound and one northbound)

Stop bars on southbound N. Adams Street can be adjusted to improve area for turning vehicles

Existing turning radius on northeast corner is 10 feet and should be increased to accommodate turning vehicles
