REASON: The City of Richmond Department of Fire and Emergency Services seeks approval for funds in the amount of \$46,650 awarded by the Virginia Department of Emergency Management.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that this funding is accepted and appropriated to the City of Richmond Department of Fire and Emergency Services, Special Fund Budget for FY16.

BACKGROUND: The grant initiative was awarded with the full support of the Virginia Department Emergency Management for provision materials needed for community training and preparedness. This project seeks to provide foam training to enhance capability to effectively respond to a "Flammable Liquid Unit Train" incident in a coordinated effort to protect the public and the environment. This project will develop and provide technical expertise that can be available statewide by calling for a hazardous materials response. Funding would provide training for fire and emergency service personnel for the region.

Upon approval of an application, the award will be made in the form of a grant. The date the approval of award is entered in the system is the "award date." Notification of award approval is made through the eGMS Grants System through an automatic e-mail to the sub-grantee point of contact listed in

the initial application. Follow the directions in the notification to accept your award documents. The authorized grant official should carefully read the award package for instructions on administering the grant and to learn more about the terms and conditions associated with responsibilities under federal awards.

Sub-grantees are obligated to submit progress reports as a condition of their award acceptance. Subgrantee Quarterly Reports must be submitted to the VDEM Grant Administrator on a quarterly basis through email and later through the eGMS System. The Subgrantee Quarterly Report must be based on the approved budget and any approved amendments. The Subgrantee Quarterly Report is available at http://www.vaemergency.gov/em-community/grants/all-grant-forms. Sub-grantees are required to report on progress towards implementing plans described in their application.

Within 30 days after the end of the period of performance sub-grantees must submit a final progress report detailing all accomplishments throughout the period of performance. After this report has been reviewed and approved by VDEM's Grant Office, a close-out notice will be completed to close out the grant. The notice will indicate the period of performance as closed, list any remaining funds that will be deobligated, and address the requirement of maintaining the grant records for five years from the date of the final report. The grantee is responsible for returning any funds that have been drawn down, but remain as unliquidated on grantee financial records.
