PURPOSE: To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept funds in the amount of \$53,350 from the Virginia Department of Emergency Management and to appropriate \$106,700 to the City of Richmond Department of Fire and Emergency Services FY2016 Special Funds Budgets for the purpose of foam team training for fire and emergency service personnel.

REASON: The City of Richmond's Fire and Emergency Services seeks approval for funds in the amount of \$53,350 awarded by the Virginia Department of Emergency Management.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that this funding is accepted and appropriated to the City of Richmond Department of Fire and Emergency Services Special Fund Budget for FY2016.

BACKGROUND: The grant initiative was awarded with the full support of the Virginia Department of Emergency Management for provision materials needed for community training and preparedness. This project seeks to provide foam training to enhance capability to effectively respond to a "Flammable Liquid Unit Train" incident in a coordinated effort to protect the public and the environment. This project will develop and provide technical expertise that can be available statewide by calling for a hazardous materials response. Funding would provide training for fire and emergency service personnel for the region.

FISCAL IMPACT/COST: The total amount of this award is \$106,700 including \$53,350 in matching funds allocated in the City of Richmond Department Fire and Emergency Services general fund operating budgets.

The purpose of the EMPG Program is to make grants to states to assist state and local governments in preparing for all hazards as authorized by the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.). Title VI of the Stafford Act authorizes FEMA to make grants for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the federal government, states, and their political subdivisions. The federal government, through the EMPG Program, provides necessary

direction, coordination, and guidance, and provides necessary assistance, as authorized in this title so that a comprehensive emergency preparedness system exists for all hazards.

As a reminder, organizations that spend more than \$750,000 in DHS funds during a fiscal year are subject to an independent audit per OMB circular A-133.

All projects must comply with Environmental and Historic Preservation (EHP) requirements. Sub-recipients must not obligate and/or expend any (federal and/or non-federal matching) funds on any project having the potential to impact environments planning and historical preservation resources without the prior approval of FEMA. A current EHP review evaluation form must be submitted as part of the VDEM application. All applicants are required to submit a completed VDEM grant package and the electronic grants on-line budget application. In order to complete the on-line budget, please follow these instructions:

To meet matching requirements, the grantee contributions must be reasonable, allowable, allocable, and necessary under the grant program and must comply with all federal requirements and regulations.
