## ORDINANCE OR RESOLUTION NO.:\_

PURPOSE: To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept grant funds in the amount of \$5,000 from the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) and to appropriate the increase to the Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities (DPRCF) Special Fund Budgets for the purpose of providing nutrition and healthy eating education, and physical activity through the DPRCF community center and Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) for youth and

REASON: The award is being made by the National Recreation and Parks Association. The grant will provide additional funding which will increase nutrition and healthy eating, and physical education to children and families in low-income areas in addition to others who may participate in

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that this funding is appropriated to the Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Special Fund Budget FY2016.

BACKGROUND: The DPRCF has sponsored the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) for more than 40 years and the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) for approximately 15 years. The SFSP and CACFP are the premier child nutrition service programs providing children nutrition and healthy meals and snacks outside of schools hours. The programs provided over 350,000 meals

to youth at 125 different feeding sites throughout the Richmond area in FY 2014 and 2015. SFSP feeding sites are located to ensure that every child who wants to participate is within walking distance. DPRCF sponsored CACFP's are located in four Richmond Public school sites where we operate Before-and-After School programs, and at DPRCF Community Center locations. This grant allows DPRCF to provide nutrition and healthy eating education to youth and families along with the CACFP. This grant agreements period is August 26, 2015 to December 23, 2015.

FISCAL IMPACT/COST: The City will receive \$5,000 in grant funding to support materials, supplies, and education to program participants.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: The acceptance of this award will allow the Departments CACFP to provide nutrition and health and physical activities to program youth.

In order to terminate this MOU for cause, and as a condition to exercising such right to terminate for cause, a party shall give the other party thirty (30) days' prior written notice of such intention to terminate, specifying in detail the grounds or reasons for such termination for cause. Following any notice of termination for cause, the receiving party shall be permitted a reasonable opportunity to cure such claimed cause to the
