Improvements to the Allen Avenue Median

ORDINANCE OR RESOLUTION NO.:_

PURPOSE: To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept a gift of improvements from the Friends of Allen Avenue Common (FAAC) for the sole purpose of redeveloping the southeast Allen Avenue median.

REASON: The FAAC would like to improve the southeast Allen Avenue median that connects Park Avenue to Monument Avenue. The FAAC have estimated the costs to be approximately \$65,000. City Ordinance 2009-159-167 states that gifted assets valued at more than \$25,000 require formal City Council approval to be accepted. For the FAAC to start the Allen Avenue median improvements the gift must be formally accepted.

RECOMMENDATION: The Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities and the Department of Public Works recommends acceptance of the financial and project management assistance to complete this project as it would provide a significant and attractive improvement to the neighborhood and the Fan District.

BACKGROUND: In July of 2014, representatives from the FAAC and Enrichmond approached the Deputy Director of Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities (DPR) about improving the southeast median which has, overtime, become an unkempt green space. DPR convened a meeting of representatives from DPW and DPU and the proponents to discuss jurisdictional rights. DPU retired from the conversation as street lights were their only connection. DPW indicated they had no issues as long as the improvements did not increase their maintenance requirements and DPR managed the project.

The FAAC engaged a landscape architect to provide conceptual designs for the property. These are attached to this document. A number of meetings were held to discuss the improvements proposed and the proper course of action needed to receive approval from the City.


