

PURPOSE: To authorize the Chief Administrative Officer to accept a gift of improvements from the Friends of Jefferson Park for the sole purpose of replacing failing playground equipment at the Jefferson Park. The value of Friends of Jefferson Park's donation is \$61,591.

REASON: The existing fitness equipment was installed in the early 1980s and has surpassed its life expectancy. The equipment has failed to the extent that refurbishments, partial replacements, and repairs are not viable options and would create unsafe conditions for equipment users.

RECOMMENDATION: The Department of Parks, Recreation, and Community Facilities recommends acceptance and installation of the fitness trail equipment as these efforts would significantly increase the attractiveness and utility of Jefferson Park.

BACKGROUND: The Friends of Jefferson Park received an award from Bon Secours in the amount of \$51,591 and an award from an anonymous donor for \$10,000. This money is to be used to purchase a nine station fitness package from the Norwell Fitness Equipment Company.
