Richmond City Council convened in Informal Session on Monday, March 14, 2016, in the Council Chamber located on the second floor of City Hall, 900 East Broad Street.

Lumpkin's Jail Heritage Site Update

Delegate Delores McQuinn thanked members of Council for their ongoing commitment to sustain the work of creating a viable heritage site before introducing Joy Bailey Bryant, Lord Cultural Resources Managing Director, who provided Council with a presentation regarding the findings of the Richmond Speaks' process for planning, design and construction of a pavilion and slavery museum at the Lumpkin's Jail site.
