PURPOSE: To re-appropriate surplus federal funds, appropriate program income, and adjust certain project activities, thereby amending the City of Richmond's 2015- 2016 Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan. The City will re-appropriate surplus Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds for Fiscal Year 2016. Total funds to be re-appropriated and or appropriated are as follows: CDBG \$458,605.00.

REASON: To enable the City to enter into and amend existing contracts with the subrecipients receiving CDBG federal funds for the completion of eligible activities.

RECOMMENDATION: Approval is recommended by the Administration.

BACKGROUND: Since 1975, the City has used Community Development Block Grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing (HUD) to implement housing and community development programs in the City's eligible neighborhoods. Federal and local regulations require that program income and surplus funds be respectively appropriated to CDBG programs. The reprogrammed funds are primarily the result of funds being recaptured from completed activities and earned program income.

Community Development Block Grant funds (CDBG):

CDBG Prior Year Surplus-\$354,311.72 CDBG 2015 Program Income - \$104,293.28 Total CDBG allocation: Increase budget by \$458,605, from \$4,171,274 to \$4,629,879.

Carver-Newtowne West NIB: Increase by \$43,605 from \$35,000 to \$78,605 for the construction of Alley and Demolition of structures in the Carver neighborhood.

NIB Area Housing Code Enforcement: Add new activity at \$145,000 for housing code enforcement activities in NIB areas of the City.

North Jackson Ward: Add new activity at \$15,000 for acquisition, disposition and demolition of properties.

Neighborhood Stabilization Program: Add new activity at \$200,000 for rehabilitation of housing under the NSP program.

Swansboro NIB: Add new activity at \$350,000 for the construction of new multi-family housing.

Eastview Revitalization: Recapture \$95,000 by reducing \$100,000 to \$5,000 planning activities.

New Clay House II: Recapture \$200,000 by reducing \$400,000 to \$200,000 for acquisition.

FISCAL IMPACT / COST: The City has received the following Federal Entitlement, program income and surplus funds in fiscal year 2015-2016: CDBG \$4,171,274.00, HOME \$1,082,299.00, ESG \$374,421.00 and HOPWA \$874,953.00. These funds total \$6,502,947.00. These funds plus prior year program income and surplus: CDBG \$458,605, HOPWA \$120,000.00 total \$7,081,552.00

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: The appropriations and re-appropriations of the City's HUD Entitlement and surplus funding will enable the City to achieve stated goals for blight reduction, increasing homeownership, strengthening neighborhoods, and assisting families and individuals in need. Many of these activities will strengthen the City's tax base over time.
