WHEREAS, it is the consensus of the Council of the City of Richmond that it would be in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Richmond and especially the residents of this area to reduce the speed limit on Semmes Avenue between West 22^{nd} Street and Forest Hill Avenue to [25] 30 miles per hour; and

WHEREAS, section 2-428 of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015), as amended, requires an appropriate study by the Department of Public Works prior to the adoption of an ordinance regulating motor vehicle traffic within the City; and

§ 1. That the speed limit on Semmes Avenue between West 22nd Street and ForestHill Avenue is hereby reduced to [25] 30 miles per hour.

§ 2. This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption or on such other date as may be fixed by traffic order of the Director of Public Works if, prior to adoption, the speed limit on the aforesaid street has been reduced to [25] 30 miles per hour.
