PURPOSE: To approve, on behalf of the City of Richmond, the proposed resolution of the Cephas v. REASON: The requested Council resolution is requested to approve, on behalf of the City, a proposed settlement of the pending Cephas v. City of Richmond case.

RECOMMENDATION: The City Administration recommends the adoption of the requested Council resolution.

BACKGROUND: Kimberly Cephas and numerous other current and former City Family Services Specialists, Family Services Workers, Social Work Specialists, Social Workers, and Benefit Program Specialists filed the collective action and class action lawsuit Cephas v. City of Richmond, Civil Action 3:15CV332 in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia on June 2, 2015. The case alleged the City's failure to pay overtime compensation as required

by the Fair Labor Standards Act and Va. Code §§ 9.1-701 through 9.1-703. On April 25, 2016, Council held a closed meeting pursuant to Va. Code §2.2-3711 (A) (7) and received a briefing from the City Attorney on a proposed settlement of the *Cephas* case. The requested Council resolution would constitute the City's approval of that proposed settlement.

FISCAL IMPACT / COST: Pursuant to its terms, the proposed settlement must remain strictly confidential. The cost associated with the proposed settlement is the subject of a budget amendment to the Fiscal Year 2015-2016 budget. No revenue will be lost.

**FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:** The cost of the proposed settlement is anticipated to have no impact on the City's debt capacity, bond rating, revenue-generating capability or long-term expenditures.
