PUBLIC HEARING: JUNE 13 2016 AT 6 P.M.

WHEREAS, section 2-1293(b) of the Code of City of Richmond (2015), as amended, prohibits an officer or employee in the classified service of the City from continuing in such position after becoming a candidate for nomination or election to an office elected by voters of an election district which includes all or part of the City or by the voters at large of the City for a constitutional office serving only the City; and

WHEREAS, this prohibition applies only to certain classified employees and not to unclassified employees; and

WHEREAS, this prohibition derived from the former section 9.13 of the Charter of the City of Richmond as adopted in 1948; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 15.2-1512.2 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, section 2-1293(b) of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015), as amended, does not apply to "emergency medical services personnel," "Firefighters," or "law enforcement officers;" and

WHEREAS, the Council believes that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Richmond that the Council request that the Chief Administrative Officer cause to be conducted a study and comparative analysis of any similar provisions in similar jurisdictions in the Commonwealth that regulate the political activity of classified employees in the manner for which section 2-1293(b) of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015), as amended, provides;

That the Chief Administrative Officer is hereby requested to cause to be conducted a study and comparative analysis of any provisions in similar jurisdictions in the Commonwealth that regulate the political activity of classified employees in the manner for which section 2-1293(b) of the Code of the City of Richmond (2015), as amended, provides.

ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

Resolution to request a study to conduct an equity study, comparative analysis of localities of classified employees being nominated or serving in an elective office in the city and to provide recommendations by December 30, 2016

BACKGROUND

This Resolution is to request that the Chief Administrative Officer conduct an equity study and comparative analysis of localities regarding City Code §2-1293 (b) which addresses classified employees being nominated or serving in an elective office in the city.

The subject of the study is to conduct research and comparative analysis for the provision expressed in City Code § 2-1293(b) under which classified employees becoming candidates for nomination or election to an elective office in the City forfeit their City employment. That law reads as follows:

No officer or employee in the classified service of the City shall continue in such position after becoming a candidate for nomination or election to an office elected by voters of an election district which includes all or a part of the City or by the voters at large of the City for a constitutional office serving only the City.

Pursuant to City Code §2-1293 (b), this provision does not apply to unclassified employees and pursuant to Virginia Code §15.2-1512.2 does not apply to emergency medical services personnel, "firefighters", and "law enforcement officers" in the Department of Fire and Emergency Services and the Department of Police.

The Resolution requests the Chief Administrative Officer to provide the study not later than December 30, 2016 with recommendations if amendments should be considered. Any recommendations considered would not be effective until after January 1, 2017.
