AWARDS AND PRESENTATIONS

There were no awards or presentations.

CITIZEN COMMENT

Marie Morton Hart addressed Council regarding the waste of electricity in City Hall during non-business hours, grass cutting and a city sign located on Interstate 95. Ms. Hart also asked why the 8th District Council representative could not have an office in her district.

Barbara Starkey-Goode, vice president – Oak Grove Civic Association, informed Council that a storage shed and restroom facilities had been removed from the Oak Grove playground, located at Halifax and Mason Streets. Ms. Starkey-Goode stated that she had been informed by Parks and Recreation that the storage shed would not be replaced. Ms. Starkey-Goode requested that Council restore the playground and replace the resources.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell responded to Ms. Starkey-Goode stating that she had been informed by Dr. Norman Merrifield, director – Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities, that the storage shed would be replaced with a better facility prior to the August National Night Out celebration.

Baron Godley requested that Council find a solution to the city's contaminated water situation and requested that additional bicycle lanes be considered for specific thoroughfares within the city.

Councilor Ellen Robertson stated that she would meet with Mr. Godley and other citizens on the status of the water within the city as this is a very critical issue.

Councilor Parker Agelasto also stated that he desired to follow-up with Mr. Godley in reference to the city's water issue. Mr. Agelasto stated that the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality will be holding public hearings related to the dumping of coal-ash into the James River by Dominion Virginia Power at Thomas Dale High School, 3900 West Hundred Road, in Chester on Wednesday, June 22nd, and Wednesday, July 6th, at 7:00 p.m. Mr. Agelasto also stated that written comments related to dumping coal-ash can be forwarded to chesterfieldpowerstationwaterpermit@deq.virginia.gov through July 21st.

President Michelle Mosby stated that she will provide information to Mr. Godley in reference to the proposed bicycle routes that are included in the city revitalization report.
