# **Central Virginia Waste Management Authority**

Whereas, The Honorable Dwight C. Jones, Mayor of Richmond, and The Honorable Members of Richmond City Council, the governing body of Richmond, Virginia, in the United States of America, do hereby unite in solidarity and common purpose to recognize, honor and celebrate the Central Virginia Waste Management Authority for its work to expand the scope of its recycling programs, as well as its dedication to the environment and sustainability; and

Whereas, The Central Virginia Waste Management Authority was created in 1990 as a quasigovernment entity pursuant to the Virginia Water and Waste Authorities Act outlined in the Virginia Code of Laws, Chapter 51, Title 15.2, as amended, to facilitate improved waste management practices to protect the health, safety and welfare of residents of the Central Virginia Region; and

Whereas, The Central Virginia Waste Management Authority serves more than one million residents throughout thirteen localities in the Central Virginia region, which includes Richmond, Colonial Heights, Hopewell, Petersburg, Ashland, and the counties of Charles City, Chesterfield, Goochland, Hanover, Henrico, New Kent, Powhatan and Prince George; and

Whereas, Dedicated to service, the Central Virginia Waste Management Authority delivers numerous efficient and economical waste management and recycling programs for its member localities, which include residential recycling services, drop off recycling of paper, cans and bottles, electronics recycling, appliance and scrap metal recycling and yard waste recycling; and

Whereas, In July of last year, with the collaboration and support of Richmond City Council and the Mayor's Office, the Central Virginia Waste Management Authority enhanced Richmond's recycling program by upgrading to 95 gallon recycling carts citywide, resulting in the collection of 10,371 tons of recyclable materials (an increase of nearly 50 percent over the amount collected in Fiscal Year 2015) and improving waste diversion and collection efficiencies by 50 percent; and

**Whereas,** As a further example of success, as of July 1, 2016, Richmond now recycles plastic bottles and containers with the number 1-7 on the bottom as well as waxy cartons; and

Whereas, Through excellent administration, management and stewardship, last year the Central Virginia Waste Management Authority recycling participation rate increased by an impressive 57 percent overall, with the number of recyclers tripling in some areas of the City;

**Now, Therefore,** Richmond City Council and Mayor Dwight C. Jones do hereby officially recognize, honor and celebrate the Central Virginia Waste Management Authority, in recognition of their work to increase recycling participation and reduce the financial and environmental costs associated with the hauling and disposal of trash in local landfills; and, thanks them for helping to make Richmond an even better and greener place to live, work, learn, love, visit and raise a family.
