#### THE CITY OF RICHMOND HEREBY ORDAINS:

§ 1. That Chapter 2, Article V, Division 11 of the Code of the City of Richmond

(2015) be and hereby is **repealed** as follows:

#### [DIVISION 11.

#### **CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION COMMISSION**

#### Sec. 2-1035. Created.

There is hereby created an advisory commission of the City of Richmond with indefinite

duration to be known as the Career and Technical Education Commission.

## Sec. 2-1036. Composition; terms of office; duties and functions; reporting.

(a) *Composition*. The Commission shall be composed of 21 members. The Council shall appoint 19 members of the Commission. The Mayor shall appoint two members of the Commission by letter to the City Clerk. All appointments shall be otherwise governed by sections 2-755 and 2-756. The members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Council as follows:

(1) A member of the Council's Education and Human Services Standing Committee, who shall chair the Commission.

(2) Two representatives from the administration of the School Division of the City of Richmond.

(3) A member of the School Board of the City of Richmond.

(4) A representative from Greater Richmond Partnership, Inc.

(5) A member of the Resource Workforce Investment Board of the Capital

Region Workforce Partnership who represents the City on that Board.

- (6) A member of the Richmond Technical Center Career and Technical Education Advisory Council.
  - (7) A representative from the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce.
  - (8) Eleven at-large members who shall either:
    - a. Reside or operate a business within the City; or
    - b. Be representatives of an organization promoting education or workforce development.

(b) *Terms of office*. The members of the Commission shall serve for terms of three years from the date of appointment. Upon the expiration of a member's term of office, that member shall continue to hold office until the successor thereof is appointed and qualified. Any

vacancy shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as provided in this subsection. All other aspects of the Commission and its membership not addressed in this division shall be governed by Article V, Division 1 of this chapter.

(c) Duties and functions. The Commission shall provide advice and recommendations to the Council, the Mayor, the School Board of the City of Richmond and the administration of the School Division of the City of Richmond concerning the best career and technical education techniques, resources, courses and opportunities available to residents of the City to enhance economic development efforts and career and technical education offerings for K-12 grade students, young adults, displaced workers and those reentering the workforce. The Commission shall work with the School Division of the City of Richmond to accomplish the goals and objectives of this division. For purposes of section 2-761, the Commission is classified as "advisory."

The Department of Economic and Community Development shall provide the necessary support for the Commission. The Commission shall meet at least once a month and the City Clerk shall keep minutes on behalf of the Commission in accordance with the requirements of the Virginia Freedom of Information Act. Eleven members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum. The Commission may adopt rules of procedure or bylaws not inconsistent with this division or other applicable law to govern the conduct of its meetings and affairs. The Commission may elect from its membership a Chairman and other officers it deems necessary in accordance with its rules of procedure or bylaws.

(d) *Reporting.* The Commission shall provide the Council, the Mayor and the School Division of the City of Richmond with recommendations concerning the provision of career and technical education within 12 months after the adoption of the ordinance establishing the Commission. In addition, the Commission shall make recommendations and provide quarterly status reports to the Council, the Mayor, the School Board of the City of Richmond, the administration of the School Division of the City of Richmond and local businesses designated by the Council's Education and Human Services Standing Committee concerning the following:

(1) The ways in which the City may increase programming of the School Division of the City of Richmond's career and technical education program to make such program comparable to successful career and technical education programs throughout the Commonwealth of Virginia.

(2) The ways in which the City may align career and technical education programs with careers and disciplines in high demand in the metropolitan Richmond area.

(3) The ways in which the City may expand programs to meet the career and technical education needs of elementary and middle school students.

(4) Collaboration with the Richmond Technical Center Career and Technical Education Advisory Council to ensure resource and staff development for course offerings and training.]

§ 2. This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon adoption.

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# ORDINANCE/RESOLUTION SUMMARY

Ordinance to abolish the Career and Technical Education Commission.

### BACKGROUND

The Career and Technical Education Commission was initially established per Ordinance No. 2009-R166-194 (adopted December 14, 2009) and abolished in 2013. Ordinance 2013-192-176, the Commission was re-established to consider revised goals and objectives for vocational options to ensure youth and adults of Richmond Public Schools to have access to high-quality career and technical education programs.
