PURPOSE: To appropriate funds received from registration fees in the amount of \$26,320.00, for the 2016 Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and Community Resilience Summit to the Department of Social Services 2017 special fund budget. Funds will be used for expenses from the 2016 Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and Community Resilience Summit held on August 3-4, 2016.

REASON: Over the course of this two-day Summit, there were educational learning tracks for youth between the ages of 13-17, parents/ caregivers, and diverse professionals for the purpose of engaging with the research behind Adverse Childhood Experiences and concrete approaches that communities around the country have taken in building Community Resilience.

RECOMMENDATION: The City's Administration and the Department of Social Services recommend approval.

BACKGROUND: Seventy percent (70%) of adults in the U.S. have experienced some type of traumatic event at least once in their lives. Adverse Childhood Studies show that many of these traumas occur before age 18 and result in disrupted brain development, adoption of at risk health behaviors, and increases the risk for disease, disability and social problems in children and adults, including developing physical and mental illness. The Center for Disease Control recognizes this epidemic requires a public health response at the national, state and local levels. Evidence has shown that by implementing trauma-informed practices within all human service systems impacting youth, adults and their families, individuals are empowered to build their resilience and enhance their overall health and well-being.

Trauma-informed care asks all human service professionals to realize the widespread impact of trauma, recognize the signs and symptoms of trauma, and respond by integrating trauma-informed knowledge into all policies, procedures and practices while actively resisting re-traumatizing the youth, families and adults we serve.

In response to this national public health issue, the City of Richmond is committed to building trauma-informed youth, family and adult service systems across our Human Services Portfolio and Our City.

FISCAL IMPACT / COST: None.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: These conference registration fees, in conjunction with the sponsorship already received, will cover conference-related expenses.
