- Affordable Housing Trust Fund was created in 2004(funded in 2014)
- Demand for affordable housing units is steadily increasing
- Supports service activities and housing development
- Quality affordable housing is a essential component of strong vibrant communities

AHTF Action Plan 5 Year Targets

- Serve 500+ families annually
- Establish consistent funding level of \$5,000,000 per year
- Increase Public awareness through education and promotion
- Annually update policies and processes
- Establish dedicated staff



AHTF Accomplishments

- \$2,195,762 Awarded to 17 Projects
- 1,101 Households Assisted
- \$31 leveraged for every Dollar Awarded
- \$50 Million in Economic Activity
- Attracted \$78 million from other funding sources
- \$2.60 was requested for every available \$1

- Supported Renovation of Cary Street Mews, and William Byrd House
- Supported New Construction of Eggleston Plaza
- Supported Key Initiatives to support Homeless programming
- Will support impactful future projects
