#### **Green City Commission Update**

Vice Chair Kim Gray arrived and was seated.

Trip Pollard, Chair of Richmond Green City Commission, updated the committee on the commission's responsibilities and duties, and reported on the reconfiguration of the commission to track five priorities included in the RVAgreen Plan: economic development, energy, environment, open space and land use, and transportation. Mr. Pollard further reported on the commission's achievements over the past years and future goals and projects. He advised the committee that the commission was also working on a policy to address the application of pesticides in the city's public parks.

#### **State Economic Development Projects**

Director of Virginia Department of General Services Chris Beschler, briefed the committee on the state's major capital projects which included the completion of the Barbara Johns Building; new construction plans for the General Assembly building and the Broad Street parking garage;

renovation plans for the old City Hall, the Virginia Supreme Court building, the War Memorial Carillon at Byrd Park, the Monroe Tomb (Hollywood Cemetery); and expansion of the Department of Forensic Science – Biotech 2 building.
