RICHMOND OFFICIAL JOINT PROCLAMATION

By virtue of the authority vested in the United States of America, Commonwealth of Virginia, Virginia Code of Laws and the Richmond City Charter: The Honorable Levar M. Stoney, Mayor of Richmond and The Honorable Members of Richmond City Council, the governing body of Richmond, Virginia, in the United States of America, do hereby and officially proclaim:

Richmond Fire Prevention Week

Whereas, The Honorable Levar M. Stoney, Mayor of Richmond, and The Honorable Members of Richmond City Council, the governing body of Richmond, Virginia in the United States of America, do hereby unite in solidarity and common purpose to declare natural and man-made emergencies and disasters to be clear and present threats to the life, health, and happiness of all Richmond residents; and

Whereas, Each one of us shares individual leadership and responsibility in helping keep ourselves and our families, friends, community, and loved ones safe from harm; and

Whereas, Fire and the products of combustion, such as heat, steam, smoke and toxic gases, can be extremely dangerous and cause traumatic injuries, burns, scalds, illness, death, destruction of property, and have sizable individual and community financial impacts; and

Whereas, Home and workplace fire safety is critically important and all Richmond residents should be proactive in their use of preventative measures regarding fire, such as being attentive while cooking; careful with smoking; and, responsible for heating maintenance and electrical needs; and

Whereas, Last year (2016), the Richmond Department of Fire and Emergency Services responded to 1,154 fire calls, which included physical injuries and the loss of six lives; traumatic stress and medical costs; and, more than \$4 million in property and real estate damages; and

Whereas, In 1920, United States President Woodrow Wilson established October 9 as a National Fire Prevention Day to promote the need for fire safety and memorialize the infamous "Great Chicago Fire" disaster, which began on October 8 and peaked on October 9, 1871 in Chicago, Illinois; and

Whereas, Since 1922, the week in which October 9 falls each year has been observed as National Fire Prevention Week and as a time to further promote safety and help prevent unintended fires and their potentially deadly and costly aftermath; and

Whereas, A dedicated resource in helping further educate Richmonders about proper fire, emergency, and disaster precautions, prevention, mitigation, preparation, response, and recovery practices is the Richmond Department of Fire and Emergency Services, which deliver educational programs during Richmond Fire Prevention Week and throughout the year; and

Now, Therefore, In recognition of National Fire Prevention Week, Richmond City Council and Mayor Levar M. Stoney do hereby re-proclaim the week in which October 9 falls each year to be Richmond Fire Prevention Week; and, encourage all Richmond residents to be fire safe and to learn, observe, and use proper fire safety precautions in their home and workplace and to educate themselves regarding emergency and disaster prevention, mitigation, protection, preparation, recovery, and response practices.

Held August 1, 2017, National Night Out is an annual neighborhood crime fighting event that establishes a vehicle for families to come together and focus on fighting crime in their neighborhood through unity and education. The event empowers residents and strengthens neighborhoods by creating an opportunity for families to visit and talk with one another and with civic groups, local officials, firefighters, law enforcement, businesses, and neighborhood organizations.

Local National Night Out events include crime prevention activities ranging from turning on porch lights to block parties and cookouts that include food and games for children.

Held each year on the first Tuesday of August, National Night Out was established in 1984 by the National Association of Town Watch as a program to help build neighborhood unity in fighting crime. The celebration includes participation in all 50 U.S. states, U.S. territories, Canada and U.S. military bases around the world.

Each year numerous local National Night Out events and activities are locally planned in neighborhoods throughout Richmond, these events are great way to meet, talk and play with neighbors and enjoy fun-filled family activities.

Producing successful larger-scale events requires great dedication and includes hundreds of hours of hard work in directing, planning, producing, communicating, advertising, coordinating, and managing, which includes overseeing ongoing and sometimes fluid organizational dynamics, logistics, volunteers, vendors, talent, attendees, health and life safety/security needs, and numerous other critical details. Many times a thankless task, successful events, with their many facets and responsibilities, are typically led and directed by a committed event manager and aided by assistants.
