Councilor Parker Agelasto provided an introduction of Ord. 2017-088.

Lee Downey, deputy chief administrative officer – Economic and Community Development was available to answer questions regarding Ord. 2017-088 and stressed city administration's opposition to the adoption of the proposed legislation.

Councilor Ellen Robertson stated that she has concerns with repealing an ordinance that facilitated the retention of a prominent business within the city.

City Attorney Allen Jackson was also available to answer questions regarding Ord. 2017-088 and stated that the previously adopted ordinance was customary.

Councilor Parker Agelasto motioned that Ord. 2017-088 be moved to the Consent Agenda, which failed to be seconded.

Councilor Ellen Robertson provided an introduction of Res. 2017-R070.

Vice President Cynthia Newbille stated that Res. 2017-R070 was not ideal; however, she supports its efforts to compensate general city employees.

Councilor Parker Agelasto emphasized the possible utilization of the annual fund balance for subsidizing a compensation study.

City Attorney Allen Jackson was available to answer questions regarding Res. 2017-R070.

Considering general city employees had not been provided an annual raise, Councilor Michael Jones also acknowledged his support for Res. 2017-R070.

Councilor Parker Agelasto proposed that Res. 2017-R070 be amended to include additional uses for annual fund balances.

After further discussion, it was the consensus of Council to continue Res. 2017-R070 and refer the proposed legislation to the October Organizational Development Standing Committee meeting for additional review.

There were no further comments or discussions concerning Consent and Regular Agenda items reviewed.

## Auditor Interview Panel Update

After discussion regarding the process for a city auditor interview panel, Council President Chris Hilbert advised members of Council that only those who participate in all candidate interviews will be allowed to vote on a finalist.

Councilwoman Reva Trammell suggested that the fourth Monday of October, November and/or December be utilized for candidate interviews.
